BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS:

Stephanie Munoz, of Waukegan, Illinois, filed a claim for reimbursement requesting \$221.35 in damages to her vehicle, which were allegedly caused when she drove over a pothole located in a privately owned parking lot of the Burlington store at 2433 S. Green Bay Road on or about October 17, 2021.

This alleged incident occurred on private property, specifically, in the privately-owned parking lot belonging to the Burlington store located at 2433 S. Green Bay Road, Racine, Wisconsin.

Because this alleged incident occurred on privately owned property, the City is not liable for these claimed damages. For this reason, it is the recommendation of the City Attorney's Office that this claim
