"Part of Blocks 56 and 57, and all of Block 58 of the Original Plat of the City of Racine in the fractional Northeast ¼ of Section 9, Town 3 North, Range 23 East, in the City of Racine, Racine County, Wisconsin as described herein: beginning at a point being the intersection of the center lines of Chatham Street and Hamilton Street proceed East along the centerline of Hamilton Street to the centerline of Michigan Boulevard, then north along the center line of Michigan Boulevard 150', then N. 87-52-44 E. 947.76', then S. 02-04-16 E. 392.20', then S. 30-02-32 E. 256.96', then S. 63-50-03 E. 132.82', then S. 07-10-57 E. 83.48', then S. 79-59-04 W. 234.06', then S. 86-03-56 W. 585.18', then S. 85-58-20 W.

269.54', then N. 09-26-21 W. 142' to the intersection of said line and the extended centerline of Dodge Street, then West along the centerline of Dodge Street to it's point of intersection with the centerline of Chatham Street, then north along the centerline of Chatham Street to the point of beginning"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City that:

Section 1. Authorization of the Bonds. For the purpose of paying the cost of the Refunding, there shall be borrowed pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the principal sum of SEVEN MILLION ONE HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$7,145,000) from Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated, Milwaukee, Wisconsin (the "Purchaser") in accordance with the terms and conditions of its purchase proposal (the "Proposal") attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 1A. Sale of the Bonds. To evidence such indebtedness, the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute, issue and sell to the Purchaser for, on behalf of and in the name of the City, General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2006A, aggregating the principal amount of SEVEN MILLION ONE HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$7,145,000) (the "Bonds") for the sum set forth on the Proposal,

plus accrued interest to the date of delivery.

Section 2. Terms of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be designated "General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2006A"; shall be dated October 5, 2006; shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof; shall be numbered 1 and upward; shall bear interest at the rates and shall mature on December 1 of each year, in the years and principal amounts as set forth on the schedule prepared by the Purchaser and attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "Schedule"). Section 4. Form of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be issued in registered form and shall be executed and delivered in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 5. Direct Annual Irrepealable Tax Levy. For the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same becomes due, the full faith, credit and resources of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged, and there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property of the City a direct annual irrepealable tax in the years 2006 through 2019 for the payments due in the years 2007 through 2020 in the amounts set forth on the Schedule.

The direct annual irrepealable tax hereby levied shall be carried onto the tax roll and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes of the City for said years are collected. So long as any part of the principal of or interest on the Bonds remains unpaid, the tax hereinabove levied shall be and continues irrepealable except that the amount of tax carried onto the tax roll may be reduced in any year by the amount of any surplus in the Debt Service Fund Account for the Bonds created below. Section 6. Segregated Debt Service Fund Account. There is hereby established in the City treasury a fund account separate and distinct from all other funds or accounts of the City designated "Debt Service Fund Account for \$7,145,000 City of Racine General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2006A, dated October 5, 2006", which fund account shall be used solely for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Bonds. There shall be deposited in said fund account all accrued interest paid on the Bonds at the time the Bonds are delivered to the Purchaser, any premium, all money raised by taxation pursuant to Section 5 hereof, and all other sums as may be necessary to pay principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same become due. Said fund account shall be used for the sole purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Bonds, shall be maintained for such purpose until such indebtedness is fully paid or otherwise extinguished, and shall at all times be invested in a manner that conforms with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and any applicable income

tax regulations (the "Regulations").

Section 7. Borrowed Money Fund. The proceeds of the Bonds (the "Bond Proceeds") (other than any premium and accrued interest which must be paid at the time of the delivery of the Bonds into the Debt Service Fund Account created above) shall be deposited into an account separate and distinct from all other funds and disbursed solely for the purposes for which borrowed or for the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Bonds.

Section 8. Arbitrage Covenant. The City shall not take any action with respect to the Bond Proceeds which, if said action had been reasonably expected to have been taken, or had been deliberately and intentionally taken on the date of delivery of and payment for the Bonds (the "Closing") would have caused the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code and the Regulations.

The City hereby further covenants and agrees that it will take all necessary steps and perform all obligations required by the Code and Regulations (whether prior to or subsequent to the issuance of the Bonds) to assure that the Bonds are obligations described in Section 103(a) of the Code, the interest on which is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes, throughout their term. The City Clerk or other officer of the City charged with the responsibility of issuing the Bonds, shall provide an appropriate certificate of the City as of the Closing, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, certifying that it can and covenanting that it will comply with the provisions of the Code and Regulations.

Further, it is the intent of the City to take all reasonable and lawful actions to comply with any new tax laws enacted so that the Bonds will continue to be obligations described in Section 103(a) of the Code, the interest on which is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes throughout their term.

The City covenants that it is a governmental unit with general taxing powers and that the Bonds are not "private activity bonds" as defined in Section 141 of the Code.

Section 12. Utilization of The Depository Trust Company Book-Entry-Only System. In order to make the Bonds eligible for the services provided by The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), the City agrees to the applicable provisions set forth in the Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations previously executed on behalf of the City and on file in the City Clerk's office.

Section 13. Undertaking to Provide Continuing Disclosure. The City hereby covenants and agrees, for the benefit of the holders of the Bonds, to enter into a

written undertaking (the "Undertaking") required by SEC Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule") to provide continuing disclosure of certain financial information and operating data and timely notices of the occurrence of certain events in accordance with the Rule. The Undertaking shall be enforceable by the holders of the Bonds or by the Purchaser on behalf of such holders (provided that the rights of the holders and the Purchaser to enforce the Undertaking shall be limited to a right to obtain specific performance of the obligations thereunder and any failure by the City to comply with the provisions of the Undertaking shall not be an event of default with respect to the Bonds).

The City Clerk, or other officer of the City charged with the responsibility for issuing the Bonds, shall provide a Continuing Disclosure Certificate for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, setting forth the details and terms of the City's Undertaking.

Section 14. Bond Insurance. The Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to agree to such additional provisions as any municipal bond insurer which makes a commitment accepted by the City to insure the Bonds may reasonably request and which are acceptable to the Mayor and City Clerk, including provisions regarding restrictions on investment of Bond Proceeds, the payment procedure under the municipal bond insurance policy, the rights of the bond insurer in the event of default and payment of the Bonds by the bond insurer and notices to be given to the bond insurer. In addition, appropriate reference to the municipal bond insurance policy shall be made in the form of Bond provided herein. Section 15. Payment of the 2006 Notes. The 2006 Notes shall be paid on their December 28, 2006 maturity date.

Section 16. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date. All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the Common Council or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.

bond insurance policy shall be made in the form of Bond provided herein. Section 15. Payment of the 2003 Notes and 2004 Notes. The 2003 Notes and 2004 Notes shall be paid on their December 1, 2006 maturity date. Section 16. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date. All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the Common Council or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.

City Clerk Place Referendum Question On Health Care on November Ballot

Whereas, escalating health insurance costs are a major hardship for City of Racine residents, businesses, and local units of government; and

Whereas, such high costs discourage business expansion and job creation in the City of Racine and burden individual citizens with high costs and the fear of losing health insurance coverage; and

Whereas, according to a recent study, Wisconsin health insurance costs are almost 1/3 higher than the rapidly rising national average; and

Whereas, by some measures the Racine area has among the highest health care costs in the nation, including the eighth highest physician costs in the United States according to a Government Accountability Office (GAO) report last year; and

Whereas, the GAO study demonstrates that these skyrocketing health care costs are a result of changes in the health insurance market which are beyond the control of local government; and

Whereas, despite the steep escalation in health insurance costs, the State Legislature (which does have the power to remedy this situation), has failed to seriously address comprehensive health care reform; and

Whereas, the following advisory referendum question is an effective way to determine whether the citizens believe that the next session of the State Legislature should take action:

"Should the Wisconsin Legislature establish a plan that will reduce health care costs by at least 15%, and guarantee access to universal, affordable health care coverage for all Wisconsin residents and families in 2008?"

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Common Council of the City of Racine hereby directs the Racine City Clerk to place the question set forth above on the November ballot as an advisory referendum question.

Be it further resolved, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the area legislators, Governor Jim Doyle, and the League of Wisconsin Municipalities.

Whereas, pawnbrokers charge as much as 60% for what is in essence a collateralized loan and consumer protection regulation is warranted in transactions involving these businesses; and

Whereas, the public health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of Racine should be protected by legislation restricting the location and record keeping requirements of such businesses and establishing consumer protections pursuant to the authority granted in Wis. Stat. sec. 134.71.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Common Council of the City of Racine hereby imposes a 90 day moratorium upon the granting of any occupancy permit for a pawnbroker business or pawnbroker's license to provide time for the Common Council to develop and implement ordinances containing appropriate restrictions for the establishment of such businesses.
