The board of parks, recreation and cultural services commissioners shall consist of 11 members who are residents of the city, two of whom shall be members of the common council, with one such member from the public safety and licensing committee; one of whom shall be a member of the county board of supervisors; and one of whom shall be a member of the board of the unified school district. The members of the board shall be appointed by the mayor, subject to confirmation by the common council. Appointments shall be made on the third Tuesday in April. Appointments of the elected officials specified in this section shall be for a term of one year and all other terms shall be three years. In April, 1999, and later, a board member shall not be eligible for appointment if such member has served six or more consecutive years on the board. Any such person is again eligible for appointment as of the April following the year in which such person's last term on the board expired. The term of office shall begin upon appointment, confirmation and qualification and shall continue until the qualification of a successor. Members of the board shall receive no compensation for their services.
