	SUBJECT: Communication from the City Attorney submitting the claim of Brinelle Nabors for reimbursement of attorney fees pursuant to Wisconsin Statute section 895.35(2)(b).		
	EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The City Attorney recommends approval of the claim of Brinelle Nabors for reimbursement of attorney fees pursuant to Wisconsin Statute section 895.35(2)(b).		
	BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS: Officer Brinelle Nabors was charged with misconduct in public office, simple battery, and disorderly conduct stemming from Officer Nabors's actions on November 20, 2015, involving a Washington Park High School student. Officer Nabors pled Not Guilty to the charges. On January 11, 2019, following a four-day jury trial, Officer Nabors was acquitted on all counts, and the Honorable Circuit Court Judge Mark Nielsen entered judgment on each Not Guilty verdict. Officer Nabors was reinstated to full duty by the City of Racine Police Department. The attorney fees incurred defending Officer Nabors's criminal prosecution are owing.		
	Wisconsin Statute section 895.35(2)(b)1., states that "the city shall reimburse a protective services officer for reasonable attorney fees incurred by the officer in connection with a criminal proceeding arising from the officer's conduct in the performance of official duties[.]" The statute defines a "protective services officer" to include a law enforcement officer. Wis. Stat. § 895.35(2)(a)2. Also, a "criminal proceeding" includes any criminal action or proceeding governed by Wisconsin Statute chapters 967 to 979, Wis. Stat. § 895.35(2)(a)1., which, collectively, is the criminal procedure code, Wis. Stat. § 967.01.		

31 32	There are five enumerated exceptions to the legislature's instruction that, if applicable to the officer's conduct, would negate the City's reimbursement obligation:		
33	a.	The officer is convicted of a crime.	
34	b.	The officer's employment is terminated for cause.	
35 36	c. The officer resigns for reasons other than retirement before the attorney fees are incurred.		
37	d.	The officer is demoted for reduced in rank.	
38	e.	The officer is suspended without pay for 10 or more working days.

40 41 42 43 44 45	In this case, as a City of Racine Police Officer, Officer Nabors qualifies as a "protective services officer," and the proceedings for Officer Nabors incurred attorney fees were criminal charges and related to his official duties. So, Officer Nabors's situation falls squarely within section 895.35(2)(b). Additionally, none of the five enumerated exceptions apply to Officer Nabors, who was acquitted on all counts and fully reinstated. Therefore, Wisconsin Statute section 895.35(2) requires the City to reimburse Officer Nabors for reasonable attorney fees.		
46 47 48 49	Officer Nabors hired Attorney Patrick Cafferty to represent him. Attorney Cafferty's invoice is appended hereto. The total fee charged were \$22,800.00. In my experience and opinion, this is a reasonable and is, in fact, far lower than might ordinarily be charged for a case of this scope.		
50 51 52	BUDGETARY IMPACT: Payment of \$22,800.00 will be made from Misc-Judgment & Claims, Account 11202 53500.		
53 54 55	OPTIONS/ALTERNATIVES: None. Under the circumstances, reimbursement under Wisconsin Statute section 895.35(2) is mandatory.		
56 57	RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approve the claim of Brinelle Nabors for reimbursement of attorney fees in the amount of \$22,800.00.
