Approval of Minutes for the May 8, 2007 Meeting.

On a motion by Karas, seconded by Anderson, the minutes were approved as printed.

1. <u>07-0586</u>

Subject: Communication from James W. Crain, 500 Wolff Street, requesting to remove northeast corner of Wolff Street and Erie Street section of sidewalk.

Recommendation: The property owner of 500 Wolff Street be granted permission to remove the sidewalk abutting their property along North Wisconsin Street.

Fiscal Note: The cost of removing the sidewalk will be borne by the property owner.

Rick read the sidewalk removal policy and referred to an overhead. He noted the owner at 500 Wolff Street does not violate any of the items in the sidewalk removal policy and

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therefore recommended approval to remove the sidewalk.

On a motion by Karas, seconded by DeHahn, the Committee approved the request.

Subject: Communication from Harbor Fest, Inc. requesting to close city right-of-way on June 21, 2007 through June 24, 2007 for Harbor Fest.

Recommendation: That Harbor Fest, Inc. be granted permission to close Festival Park Drive between 5th Street and 6th Street, and 5th Street between Festival Park Drive and Lake Avenue, for Harbor Fest from 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 21, 2007 thru 8:00 a.m. on Monday, June 25, 2007, in accordance with their request.

Further recommends that permission be granted with the following stipulations:

- A. hold harmless agreement be executed.
- B. Liability insurance certificate be filed prior to this event.
- C. Any overtime costs incurred by any City department be charged to the sponsor.
- D. The sponsor shall notify all abutting property owners seventy-two (72) hours in advance of this event.
- E. The sponsor shall pay a \$300.00 special event fee.

Further recommends that the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer and Chief of Police provide limited assistance, in the interest of public safety, to implement this event.

FISCAL NOTE: There will be nominal costs to various City departments, on a regular shift basis, to assist in implementing this event.

Rick read the communication from Harborfest and indicated this is an annual request and read the usual stipulations and noted the fee is \$300.

5. Subject: Item 14 of May 2, 2000, being a communication from the 1st Vice-President of Racine Area Veterans, Inc. wishing to discuss the relocation of the Walker Manufacturing World War II Memorial Stone from its present location on Michigan Boulevard.

Recommendation: The communication be received and filed.

Fiscal Note: Not applicable.

John Rooney noted the monument had been moved off the Walker property and relocated in between Rooney and Pugh Recreational Areas. He noted it would be in the way of the Pointe Blue development where the public roads would hook-up to the existing parking lot in the Rooney Recreational Area. He stated the monument was going to be moved further to the north and east of the parking lot in Rooney Recreational Area between the parking lot and walkway. The item can be received and filed.

Subject: Item 16 of May 4, 1999, being a communication from a representative of the W.H. Pugh Oil Co. wishing to discuss the purchase of a portion of the Walker property located on the north side of Reichert Court.

7. <u>07-0499</u>

Subject: Communication from the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer recommending that Hillcrest Circle from Wright Avenue to the dead end and Oakdale Avenue from Wright Avenue to Athens Avenue be paved and the costs charged to the abutting property owners.

Recommendation: That a preliminary resolution be introduced for the paving of Hillcrest Circle from Wright Avenue to the dead end and Oakdale Avenue from Wright Avenue to Athens Avenue.

Fiscal Note: Not applicable at this time. Approval of the preliminary resolution only authorizes the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer to conduct a public hearing.

Rick noted the condition of the pavement and approval for a preliminary resolution to be drafted. Under normal circumstances these streets that have been turned down by public hearing and the Common Council have to wait five years, but due to the poor conditions it dictates replacement. He noted this street has been before the City Council three times in the last three years. Alderman DeHahn noted he has been on these streets and has seen the poor condition and that it has been reduced to gravel. He indicated the City could be liable for injuries on the street and requested the Committee consider authorizing a preliminary resolution.

On a motion by DeHahn, seconded by Coe, the Committee approved a preliminary resolution for street improvements. Karas voted Nay.

Subject: Direct Referral. Communication from the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer submitting the request of the Village of Mt. Pleasant for the City of Racine to participate in the cost of paving 16th Street from west of Ostergaard Avenue to west of Oakdale Avenue.

Recommendation: That the Mayor and City Clerk enter into an agreement with the Village of Mt. Pleasant for the rubbilization and overlaying of bituminous concrete on 16th Street from STH 31 to Ostergaard Avenue.

Further recommends that the City of Racine agrees to pay 48% of the construction cost for its share of the construction project for the rubbilization and placement of bituminous concrete and 36% of the engineering, legal and administrative costs which are currently estimated at \$106,117.00. The City of Racine's final cost will be based upon the actual cost to perform the work on the City's share of the project based upon actual bid pricing.

Further recommends that funds to defray the cost of this work are available

in the intergovernmental shared sewer revenue fund.

Fiscal Note: Funds are available as herein delineated.

Rick explained the project desired by the Village of Mt. Pleasant and requested the item be deferred until plans, specifications and estimates from the Village can be submitted for review and budgeting. Alderman Karas inquired whether sewer revenue dollars could be used for the project and Rick stated that streets being paved with sewer revenue dollars are Oakes Road and the completed project on Chicory Road.

On a motion by Karas, seconded by DeHahn, the Committee deferred the communication.

Recommendation: Contract 40-07 (K7-046), 2007 Sewer Lining, be awarded to Visu-Sewer Clean & Seal, Inc., Pewaukee, WI, at their bid price of \$774,769.25, they being the lowest responsible bidder.

Rick submitted bid results with Visu-Sewer Clean and Seal submitting the low bid in the amount of \$774,769.25.

On a motion by Karas, seconded by DeHahn, the Committee approved the bid of the lowest responsible bidder and authorized the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into a contract.

Recommendation: The Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to renew the lease agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Administration for the Department of Corrections for 5,894 square feet at the City Hall Annex, for the time period of January 1, 2008 to December 31, 2012. The rental rate for 2008 will be \$76,150.48 and will increase in accordance with the consumer price index.

Fiscal Note: This lease will generate a total revenue of \$404,293.24.
