On a motion by Hart, seconded by Weidner, the Committee approved the minutes as printed.

Subject: Communication from the Racine County Economic Development Corporation requesting permission to close Junction Avenue from Washington Avenue to Sixteenth Street, on Saturday, June 20, 2009, from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for the Second Annual Uptown Festival.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 4-28-09: The Uptown Improvement Organization be granted permission to close Junction Avenue, between Washington Avenue

and 16th Street, on Saturday, June 20, 2009, from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., for the second annual Uptown Festival.

Further recommends that permission be granted with the following stipulations:

- A. A hold harmless agreement be executed.
- B. A liability insurance certificate be filed prior to this event.
- C. Any overtime costs incurred by any City department be charged to the sponsor.
- D. The sponsor shall notify all abutting property owners seventy-two (72) hours in advance of this event.
- E. The sponsor shall pay a \$250.00 special event fee.

Further recommends that the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer and Chief of Police provide limited assistance, in the interest of public safety, to implement this event.

Hart made a motion that the resolution be adopted as amended to delete Summit Avenue and the alley at Ehlert Street/Glen Street; Luedtke Avenue/Root River E-W; and the alley at Ehlert Street/Glen Street; Luedtke Avenue/Root River N-S, seconded by Weidner. On a roll call vote, members voting Aye: Hart, Weidner, DeHahn; members voting Naye: Coe.

Rick explained the ordinance that was on the books that Mayor Friedal asked to be deleted. He noted that while the City does not oil streets anymore, there are some applicable sections of the ordinance that could be modified at later date, and asked it be considered for being left in as an ordinance.

Subject: Communication from the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer submitting an amendment to the KRM resolution to provide additional funding.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 4-28-09: That Amendment No. 2 to the agreement entitled "Cooperative Agreement to Conduct Advanced Planning, Environmental Studies, and Other Activities Attendant to the Proposed Commuter Rail Passenger Train Service in the Kenosha-Racine-Milwaukee Corridor" to increase the City of Racine's share from \$16,677.00 to \$22,500.00, be approved. The City's share of the cost can either be in the form of a cash payment or in-kind services.

Fiscal Note: There are funds available in the Capital Improvement Program to pay 100% of this amendment. However, the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer's services is a member of the technical advisory committee and, therefore, his wages are accounted for to meet the in-kind service alternative.

Rick submitted an amendment to the resolution for additional funding. He noted the increased share of funding was in cash dollars or in kind services. He would try to provide as much in kind service as possible, but the cash amount is also in the CIP.

On a motion by Hart, seconded by Weidner, the Committee approved the amendment and authorized the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into the agreement.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 4-28-09: That the Assistant Commissioner of Public Works/Engineering be authorized and directed to submit to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources an Urban Nonpoint Source and Storm Water Planning Grant Application for an upgrade to the water quality planning portion of the Storm Water Management Plan. John explained the grant application and noted it is for modeling or using WinSLAMM software and noted the grant needs to be accompanied by a resolution supporting the grant and showing local fiscal share. The grant would be used to apply for funding in 2010.
