DEPARTMENT: Community Health Programs (CHP)

REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF: April 2007

Highlights:

- o Two public health nurses have resigned. Anne Reinhold left during April after 15 years working with our department. Karin Dinda left May 1 after 13 years service. We will miss them. We have begun advertising to fill the positions.
- On April 4, the first Immunization Court session was held at City Hall. Staff from Racine Unified School District and the district Attorney's Office met with parents of children behind on immunizations. The court session is held during the Wednesday Immunization clinic so that children may receive their needed immunizations and then be up to date.
- Jeff Schmidt gave classes on sexually transmitted diseases for a Walden School health class on April 16 and for a health class at Racine Youthful Offenders Correctional Facility on April 17.
- O Public health nurses continue to offer prenatal classes to clients in the Prenatal Care Coordination Program. The group meeting provide clients with education but also the group setting allows them to meet with other women who are also going through similar experiences of pregnancy. This month three classes were held with total attendance of eleven.
- o The Racine Infant Mortality Coalition continues to meet and work toward reducing infant mortality in our community. Dr. Teresa Johnson applied for and received a \$50,000 grant to be used for establishing the infrastructure for the FIMR (fetal and infant mortality review) process. The Cribs for Kids program has ordered the first 15 cribs to be given to families who do not have a crib for their baby. Pat Anderson arranged for messages related to infant mortality to be played on CAR25. Others are working on public service announcements on radio stations.
- O Youth Connections offered a seminar, "Promoting Healthy Recovery from Sexual Abuse" which was attended by about 60 professionals in the community. Evaluations of the program were very positive.
