Letteney **Reviewed By:** N/A 8 9 **SUBJECT:** Communication presented by Alderman Weidner sponsoring Ordinance 0004-25 – Amended Public Comment Procedure, as amended by the Executive Committee at its September 10 2, 2025, meeting. 11 12 13 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:** Proposed Ordinance 0004-25 – Amended Public Comment Procedure, would amend the 14 Code of Ordinances regarding the rules for public comments during Common Council meetings. 15 Specifically, it would amend Chapter 2, Article II, Division 3, Section 2-64(6)(b), of the Code of 16 Ordinances by adding the following sentence to the language read by the clerk at the beginning 17 of the public comment period: "We encourage you to submit any detailed concerns in writing to 18 19 the city clerk's office, where they can be properly documented and directed for response." Note: This is the language as recommended by the Executive Committee at its September 20 2, 2025, meeting. 21 22 **BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:** 23

24 As it currently exists, Chapter 2, Article II, Division 3, Section 2-64(6)(b), of the Code of 25 Ordinances sets forth the rules for persons addressing the Common Council during the Public Comments portion of Common Council meetings. If approved as proposed by Alderman 26 27

Weidner, the limits on Public Comment would significantly be narrowed.

This is the *existing* language of Racine Ordinances section 2-64(6): 28 (6) Public comment, if any. 29 (a) Persons desiring to address the common council shall be limited to three minutes. 30 The public comment period shall be limited to a total of 30 minutes, unless 31 extended by the mayor with the concurrence of two-thirds of the common council 32 members present. Priority for those desiring to address the common council shall 33 first be given to residents of the City of Racine, next to non-residents who own or 34 operate a business within the City of Racine, and finally to all other persons, time 35 permitting. The clerk shall provide a sign-in sheet, which shall include an 36 indication whether the speaker resides or owns or operates a business within the 37 City of Racine 38 (b) Prior to the public comment period, the clerk shall read substantially the following 39 language: 40 The public comment segment is an opportunity for citizens to speak directly to the 41 common council. Speakers will limit their remarks to three minutes. 42 There shall be no dialogue or interaction between the speaker and elected officials 43 or staff. This time is not intended to be a debate or discussion. 44 The common council shall not hear personal complaints or attacks against any 45 city employee or elected official or any matter related to an individual claim, 46 citation, appeal, or lawsuit. Profane, disruptive, threatening, or conduct that 47 otherwise impedes the safe, orderly, and effective conduct of the common council 48 meeting is equally unacceptable during the public comment period as it is during 49 all other portions of city meetings. When a group of people representing one 50 viewpoint wishes to address the council, one person should be appointed the 51 designated speaker for the group. Candidates for public office may not use this 52 opportunity to campaign for office. 53 Speakers during the public comment period shall follow all rules of the common 54 council and rulings of the chair, including a decision to terminate the remarks if 55 the speaker does not adhere to these rules. Public comment shall be limited to 56 ideas or concerns regarding the City of Racine. 57 Under the *proposed* language, as amended by the Executive Committee, the rules for 58 Public Comment under Section 2-64(6)(b), the following sentence would be as the last sentence: 59

We encourage you to submit any detailed concerns in writing to the city clerk's

office, where they can be properly documented and directed for response.
