## Project BOTOLPH/THOR

Is the plan to use the Homeward Bound site for Community (Victory) Gardens and a Farmers Market and mobile information point.

### Stages

Using youth and others from The King Lincoln area and others have them carry out a survey of area residents within 2 blocks of the site, churches within a 6 block area and those using the Martin Luther King Jr. Community Center. This survey will not only help the program to know how many beds may be needed but to educate and build rapport with neighbors.

Hold a series of informational meetings at the local COP House with those interested in being part of the program, to sign up for the garden plots and identify needs to those interested but are limited from full participation. Lack of gardening skills, seeds, tools, etc, will be addressed.

As the first two steps are going on, the site will have trash picked up and properly disposed of.

Once a count has been made and those interested have been signed up. The beds needed will be made, and dirt will be delivered. Water tanks will be purchased, filled, and placed on site.

Ribbon cutting and planting party.

After step 4 on an ongoing basis groups such as Eat Right Racine, City of Racine Health Dept and others will be invited to attend the project area to set up informal displays to educate on a wide range of subjects.

A picnic area will be created for further enjoyment of the area

Latter in the year a market will be created where area residents may sell surplus crops and other goods. The project will invite vendors from around Racine County Farmer's Market to sell at this site too.

After hard freeze, the beds will be cleaned and composted.

During the Fall and Winter neighborhood meetings will take place at The COP House Dr Martin Luther King Jr. Center on Gardening and how to improve the site for the next year. Groups like Eat Right Racine and others will be invited back to speak again.
