Tom Eeg discussed the Johnson Control proposal and noted it is a proposal to identify projects that would have payback and the reduction in operating expenditures would pay back the capital investment made by Johnson Control. He noted several projects were available, such as more efficient lighting in parking lots and ramps, lighting at the safety buildings, chillers at the library, City Hall annex air conditioning and also evaluate the library for some of their utility costs. The proposal would examine some of the potential savings and payback and noted the appropriate action would be to authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into a Memo of Understanding with Johnson Controls for this analysis. He noted it would be done at no cost to the City.

Further recommends that these rates apply to all streets unless the actual construction cost is less, then the front foot cost shall be reduced accordingly.

**Fiscal Note:** These rates are established so that the abutting property owner pays for 100% of the cost of such street improvements.

John Rooney indicated the 2007 assessment rates needed to be amended to include industrial paving up to 48' wide and 10" industrial curb and gutter. He noted the cost associated with the wider sections are substantially higher and needed to be approved in advance of the paving on Oakes Road.
