To create Secs. 50-65 and 50-66 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine, Wisconsin relating to Annual fire prevention inspection fees.

The Common Council of the City of Racine do ordain as follows:

Part 1:

Secs. 50-65 and 50-66 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine are hereby created to read as follows:

"Sec. 50-65. Annual fire prevention inspection.

The officers of the bureau of fire prevention shall conduct annual fire prevention inspections for each building, structure, and premises in the City of Racine and charge the property owner a fee based on occupancy classification. This fee shall apply to taxable and tax exempt property alike.

Sec. 50-66. Fire prevention inspection fee schedule and provisions.

(a) Fees, based on occupancy classification:

(1)	Public Assembly	\$125
(2)	Educational Institutions	\$125
(3)	Institutional	\$250

(4)	Residential Multi-Family (3 units up)	\$125
(5)	Stores, Office	\$100
(6)	Basic Industry, Utility, Defense	\$125
(7)	Manufacturing	\$225
(8)	Storage, Warehouse	\$100
(9)	Special, not classified	\$75

(10) Compliance Inspections for Wisconsin Health and Social Services

Community Based Residential Facilities (CBRF)
Single Family Home \$50
Multi-Family Homes \$100

- (b) The annual fire prevention inspection fee shall constitute a special charge against the property under Wis. Stat. § 66.601(16), and shall be placed on the annual tax roll for collection as a special charge. All proceedings related to the collection of real estate taxes shall apply.
- (c) Five percent of the total annual fire prevention inspection fees collected shall be used exclusively for the Fire Safety and Education programs.
- (d) All buildings, structures, and premises owned by the State of Wisconsin, and the United States Government shall be exempt from the annual fire prevention inspection fee."

To amend Sec. 6-137 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine, Wisconsin relating to Alcoholic Beverages - Nonrenewal, suspension and revocation.

The Common Council of the City of Racine do ordain as follows:

Part 1:

Section 6-137(b) of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine is hereby amended by deleting in the second sentence, "and no other license issued under this article may be granted within 12 months of the date of revocation to the person whose license was revoked."; and by adding a period after the word "clerk" in the second sentence; by adding the following third sentence: "No license shall be issued for any premises if a license has been revoked (or voluntarily surrendered after the common council has voted to pursue a due process hearing) within 6 months prior to application."; and by adding a fourth sentence: "No license shall be issued to any person who has had a license issued pursuant to this article revoked within 12 months prior to application."

13. <u>Ord.41-06</u> Ordinance No. 41-06

Sponsors:

To create Section 6-19 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine, Wisconsin relating to Alcohol beverages - licensee responsibility for the control of patrons on the licensee's building lot and parking lot.

The Common Council of the City of Racine do ordain as follows:

Part 1:

Section 6-19 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine is hereby created to read as follows:

"Sec. 6-19. Off-licensed premises conduct of patrons and persons as a basis for disciplinary actions.

A. Purpose.

The purpose of this ordinance is to protect the peace, tranquility and property values of the neighborhood in which a Class "A", "Class A", Class "B", "Class B", or "Class C" (if available) premise licensed under this ordinance is located.

B. Responsibility of licensee.

Over and above the other provisions of this chapter and chapter 125, Wis. Stat., every Class "A", "Class A", Class "B", "Class B", or "Class C" (if available) licensee licensed under this chapter shall, during hours of operation of the licensed premises, be responsible for the conduct of patrons and persons who are not on the licensed premises, but are present on the following described off-licensed premises' property:

- 1. Parking lot owned or operated by licensee which serves the licensed premises;
- 2. The lot upon which the building being the subject of the license or parking lot serving the licensed premises is situated;

Examples of conduct which could form the basis for an order hereunder include, but are not limited to:

- 3. Loitering where accompanied by loud noise, threats, fighting, open intoxicants, consumption of intoxicants, weapons use or display, illegal drug use or sale, urination, or otherwise disturbing, disorderly, or illegal conduct;
- 4. Loitering of persons under the influence of alcohol beverage or drugs.

The licensee shall be responsible to monitor off-licensed premises property for compliance with this ordinance. The licensee shall have a duty to direct patrons or persons engaged in loitering to immediately leave property. The licensee is not to use physical force to remove any such person or patron. Should notified persons and patrons fail to comply, licensee shall have an obligation to call the city police department for assistance. The licensee may elect to first call the police department if the licensee has concern for their safety.

"Licensee" shall mean and include any person having control of the operation of the licensed premises.

C. Complaints.

Complaints may be made by the mayor, common council, committee, State of Wisconsin, an alderperson, police chief, city attorney, and any resident of the City of Racine.

Complaints shall be made in writing and filed with the city clerk. The city clerk shall direct the complaint to the chair of the Public Safety and Licensing Committee. With respect to complaints of illegal drug use or sale, the city clerk shall not direct the complaint to the committee until first consulting with the

police department and receiving a determination that the review of the complaint by the committee will not interfere with a law enforcement investigation. The chair shall review the complaint and any other documentation available to the chair, including, but not limited to, police reports and statements of the complainant, licensee, or others, to determine whether the complaint has sufficient merit to be placed on the committee agenda.

D. Committee action on complaint.

The committee shall order the licensee to appear before it to discuss the complaint and potential remedies. After hearing from the complainant, licensee and all interested parties, and reviewing all applicable reports, statements and documentation, the committee shall have four (4) options:

- 1. No action taken. No action shall be taken on the complaint if it is unfounded, without merit, or if the alleged conduct is outside of the effective control of the licensee.
- 2. Oral recommendations. Oral recommendations may be given from the committee to the licensee on how the licensee could address the issues raised in the complaint.
- 3. Written recommendations. If the committee finds that the complaint has merit and that a reasonable remedy exists, the committee may cause a written recommendation be sent to licensee through the U.S. mail, first class, postage prepaid. The written recommendation shall include the committee's finding on the complaint, the remedies, the timetable and/or deadlines for compliance, and an order to appear back before the committee on a specific date or dates to determine compliance with directives. The only portion of the written recommendation which would subject the licensee to discipline for noncompliance is that portion ordering the licensee to appear before the committee.
- 4. Orders. If the committee finds the complaint has merit, and that a reasonable remedy exists, and that written recommendations are inappropriate or ineffective, the committee may recommend to the common council that formal orders be issued by the common council. Unless otherwise stated, orders are permanent, unless rescinded, as long as the licensee maintains the same type of license at the location being the subject of the complaint. Orders may include, but are not limited to, the following remedial actions.
- 1. Reduction in hours of operation of licensed premises;
- 2. Prohibition of the sale of carryout alcohol beverages;
- 3. Establishment of specified security measures;
- 4. Prohibition of loitering.
- E. Common Council action on complaint. Upon recommendation by the committee for written orders as provided herein, the common council shall order the licensee to appear before the common council. After meaningful opportunity for the licensee to be heard, the common council shall issue the

order that it deems appropriate. Orders from the common council will be sent to the licensee at the address of the licensed premises by first class mail, postage prepaid.

- F. Committee review. After orders issued by the common council, the committee shall conduct such reviews as it deems necessary and sufficient in order to monitor compliance by licensee with the orders. If at any review it appears to the committee that the licensee is materially noncompliant, it may require the city attorney to commence formal disciplinary proceedings for violation of the orders.
- G. Violations. Violations of a final order of the common council, regardless of subsequent remedial measures, shall constitute grounds for disciplinary action, including a ten (10) day suspension per violation of noncompliance."

14. <u>Ord.42-06</u>

Ordinance No. 42-06

Sponsors:

To create Sec. 6-59 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine, Wisconsin relating to Alcoholic beverages - Grant of conditional license.

The Common Council of the City of Racine do ordain as follows:

Part 1:

Section 6-59 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine is hereby created to read as follows:

"Sec. 6-59. Grant of conditional license.

(a) Notwithstanding the time limits set forth herein, whenever the proposed licensed premises is a building to be newly constructed or an existing building upon which major alteration, addition, renovation or other similar work is

required in order to bring the premises in conformity with the representations made to the common council as part of the application and consideration of the application, the common council, upon recommendation of the Public Safety and Licensing Committee, may grant a license conditional upon the satisfactory completion of such construction, alteration, addition, renovation or other work, or such annexation.

- (b) The Common Council, in making such a conditional grant of a license, may direct the city clerk to withhold the issuance of the license for such time, not to exceed nine (9) months, as the common council deems a reasonable period for completion of such work in conformity with all such representations made to the common council, and/or completion of the annexation. Upon request of the applicant, this period may be extended for an additional period not to exceed six (6) months, and the license may be renewed one time with issuance withheld, but no such extension shall be granted unless the applicant has already completed a substantial portion of the construction or renovation of the premises with the original time set by the common council for withholding of the issuance of the license pending completion of the work. The common council may further require the applicant to notify the city clerk upon completion of the work, after which the common council shall cause such inspection of the premises as it deems appropriate to ascertain that the premises is in conformity with all material representations made to the common council at the time of the granting of the license. Upon satisfactory completion of the work, the common council may direct the city clerk to issue the license.
- (c) Any material failure to conform with all such representations made to the Common Council as to the proposed licensed premises within the time set for completion of such work and any extensions of such time shall render the decision to grant the license void, and shall be deemed a denial of the application by the common council as of the expiration of the time or extended time for completion of construction.
- (d) In any case where there is a conditional grant of license, and the license is ordered withheld for a time period or periods to allow for construction, and the applicant subsequently fails to satisfy the conditions of the grant of the license by satisfactory completion of such construction within the allotted time, the entirety of the license fee shall be non-refundable."

Sec. 6-54 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine is hereby amended by deleting the period at the end of the first sentence and adding the words "at least two weeks prior to the city clerk's submission of the application to the common council."; and by deleting the second sentence; by adding the words, "and contact phone numbers" after the word "address" in the fourth sentence; by adding "(s)" to the word "person" in the fourth sentence; by adding the following sixth sentence to the section: "At the time the application for a new or changed license is submitted, the applicant shall also submit the answers to a written questionnaire and provide a written business plan which conforms to an outline available in the city clerk's office."
