Dear Mayor Mason:

The attached report contains general information on ice and snow control operations within the City of Racine.

Ice control and snow removal in urban areas are typical examples of expanding demands for public works service. Public dependence on vehicular transportation grows continuously, with a proportionate increase in the levels of service demanded for salting, plowing and snow removal. Our ice and snow control operations policy is sound, and we shall continue to perform to the best of our ability in combating ice and snow within the scope of approved manpower, equipment, materials and allocated funds.

The following report is a broad outline of operational procedures, and the detailed operational programs which are implemented by each department. By involving many departments in the City, ice and snow emergency operations can be completed rapidly and thereby reduce the time the hazardous street conditions exist. The type of operation which is implemented is determined by considering many variables including; personnel available, temperature, time of occurrence, depth of snow, weather forecast, traffic conditions, storm conditions, and "good common sense."

Pursuant to our current billet of manpower, equipment, and budget, the level of service we can provide is as follows:

1. The City of Racine consists of 88 miles of streets (state highways, arterials, and collectors), for which DPW plows to bare pavement. The goal for these streets is to have all snow and ice removed from these streets ***within 24 hours of the cessation of snowfall.***
2. The City of Racine consists of 172 miles of local streets and accepts that these streets may be snow and ice covered and that drivers must adapt their driving habits to these conditions. It is the goal of the City of Racine that all local streets are ***passable within 24 hours of the cessation of snowfall.***

I hope that this report will give you a better understanding of the Department of Public Works' snow and ice control operations.

Level of Service

Bare Pavement Streets

Bare pavement streets total 88 miles of the City of Racine's 260 miles of total streets. Streets in the bare pavement program consist of state connecting highways, arterials, collectors and local streets with special circumstances.

The goal for bare pavement streets is to have all snow and ice removed from all driving lanes within 24 hours of the cessation of snowfall.

Local Street System

The remaining 172 miles of streets are local streets and the City of Racine accepts that these streets may be snow and ice covered and that drivers must adapt their driving habits to these conditions. It is the goal of the City of Racine that all local streets shall be passable within 24 hours of the cessation of snowfall.

1. Responsible for clearing snow and ice from front and rear porch and stairs of City Hall building. Responsible for snow removal at EV Charging Station.
2. Responsible for clearing snow and ice from front stairs at City Hall Annex.

E. Contracted Services

1. Responsible for all off-street parking facilities under their contract (see list). Four Seasons Lawn Care LLC will provide all snow and ice operations under Contracted Services.

PARK AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

A. Park Maintenance Division

Responsible for:

1. All sidewalks and steps fronting City-owned property (see attached list)
2. All bridge sidewalks
3. Public alleys for plowing

D. Storm Warning Service

Murray and Trette, Palatine, Illinois, Telephone No. 847-963-9000, provides the Department of Public Works with a storm warning service of four hours of advance notice to any approaching problems. Furnishing detailed information with probability factors and color code alert system.

Regular Work Hours - Department of Public Works Field Office is contacted by telephone.

Outside Regular Work Hours - Superintendent of Street Maintenance is contacted by telephone; he then notifies the Commissioner of Public Works if needed.

When we are notified that a storm is imminent and preparations must be made for ice and snow control and/or snowplowing, two supervisors are placed on a "storm warning watch."

E. Snow Emergency

CITY OF RACINE, SNOW AND ICE CONTROL
Department Responsibility
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When it is determined an emergency exists in the City by reason of a heavy snow storm, Commissioner of Public Works may declare a "snow emergency."

Commissioner of Public Works contacts the Mayor, Police Chief, City Administrator and news media as listed in the Ordinance Section.

Phase IV - SNOW REMOVAL

A. (Work performed under Phase IV operation shall be scheduled during regular work shifts.)

**STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE
PLOWING TRUCKS**

1. Check Oil Level -- Diesel, 15-W-40; Gas 10-W-30
Check Antifreeze;
Check Tires;
Drain Air Brake Systems
Check Fuel;
Check Lights;
Check in on radio to test operation and inform office radio is in service.
2. Hydraulic Drive
 - A. All Plowing units have electric controls located in the cab:
 - B. Color code of hydraulic control levers in cab:
 - Red - Power Takeoff
 - Orange - Dump Box
 - Green - Spreader
 - White - Plow lift or lower
 - Black - Plow reverse (only with power reverse plows)
3. Put sand in box for traction - approx. 1-1/2 loader buckets - DPW #70 or 73
4. Keep some weight of plow on front of truck for better traction.
5. Sign out for shovel.
6. Gear ratio to plow in:
 - A. Automatic Transmission - 3rd & 4th gears - light snow
1st & 2nd gears - heavy snow
7. Apply emergency brake when driver leaves truck.
8. Trucks with air brakes must have tanks (air) manually drained at end of each shift.
9. Lights:

Plowing - use amber lights and plow lights.

10. Plow blades to be raised:

- A. Main Street Bridge

POLICIES OF PLOWING SNOW ON SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. Streets with grass medians - General policy is to plow snow to curb. Should conditions prevail that warrant using median; i.e. extra heavy snow storm - one pass can be plowed to median at Supervisor's discretion.
2. Streets with public/undeveloped land on one side - General policy is to favor residential side; i.e. plow an extra pass toward vacant side, but no custom plowing during storm.
 - a. Osborne Boulevard - Graceland Boulevard to Spring Street
 - b. Graceland Boulevard - Kentucky Street to Ohio Street
 - c. Michigan Boulevard - Barker Street to Goold Street
Augusta Street to north of William Street
Melvin Avenue south to dead end
 - d. South Main Street - 21st Street to DeKoven Avenue
 - e. South Main Street - 16th Street south to dead end
 - f. Riverside Drive - Clayton Avenue to Cedar Bend Avenue
 - g. South part of McKinley Avenue - Cedar Bend Avenue to 500 feet north of
Cedar Bend Avenue
3. Plowing snow to the undeveloped side of the street. This policy favors plowing the majority of snow to the undeveloped side of the street.
 - a. Knoll Place - Rosalind to Concord (east side)
 - b. Rosalind Avenue - Knoll Place to Kearney Avenue (south side)
 - c. Thunderbird Drive - Erie Street to Marquette Drive (north side)
 - d. Ruby Avenue - Carlton Drive north to dead end
3 Mile Road south to dead end south of Greenfield Road
 - e. Graceland Boulevard - Osborne to Lathrop Avenue
 - f. Republic Avenue - Lathrop Avenue to Ohio Street
 - g. Walden Way - Foxwood Rd. to Dead End
4. Streets with medians, rumble strips, left turn lane - General policy is to plow two travel lanes open and keep open. After snow subsides, medians, etc., can be cleaned up where necessary at supervisor's discretion.
5. 16th Street - Plow passes follow centerline regardless of Mt. Pleasant design, particularly section between Ostergaard and Oakdale.
6. Bridges & viaducts will have snow removed after all plowing operations.
 - a. Main Street Bridge
 - b. State Street Bridge
 - c. Spring Street @ Root River

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- d. Marquette Street @ Root River
- e. Memorial Drive @ Root River

7. Fire hydrants shall be marked by the Racine Water Utility. DPW WILL NOT dig them out. Fire hydrants shall be kept free of snow by the abutting property owner, Racine Water Utility, and Racine Fire Department.

8. Mailboxes will not be dug out. They will be plowed within 2 feet of the curb line. It is the property owner's responsibility to provide access to mailbox.

9. Damage to mailboxes by snowplows (minor damage):

- a. Plow operator not to call traffic investigator - report to supervisor. (Update in accordance with Deputy City Attorney 1992).
- b. Supervisor to check damage and complete report.
- c. Repair claims to go to Common Council for action - insurance.
- d. Minor damage repairs are made by DPW crews.

10. Sump pump water discharged into street:

- a. Connecting highways, arterials, collectors - maintain travel lane.
 - 1. Blade ice off street
 - 2. Place salt to achieve "bare pavement."
- b. Local streets - maintain travel lane.
 - 1. Do not blade ice from street on "unimproved surface."
 - 2. Place sand and salt where necessary.
 - 3. We do not take action if sump pump is only impacting parking lane.

11. Accidents - Follow normal working procedure.

12. Plow blade down - Travel lanes when snow can be windrowed to side. Parking lanes if street

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has been plowed.

13. Damage to lawns by snow plows will be restored as weather permits in late Spring. This includes but is not limited to topsoil, seed, fertilizer, mulch, and sodding if necessary.

3. Public buildings (where there is a high volume of pedestrian traffic).
4. Steep hills and inclines.
5. Intersections which have a history of traffic accidents during snow and ice events.
6. Locations may be added or deleted pending staff review and approval by the Commissioner of Public Works. Example: Crossing guard locations, yearly review indicates barrel is not being used or is being misused.

A message about.....*Shoveling Sidewalks*



All property owners in the City of Racine are required by City Ordinance 82-109 to remove snow and ice from sidewalks abutting their property.

All snow and ice must be removed from the full width of the sidewalk within 24 hours after cessation of a snowfall.

Failure to remove or cause to be removed all snow and ice from the sidewalk in front, along the side of, or adjacent to your property ***will result*** in a violation notice being mailed accompanied by an inspection fee in the amount of \$50.00. If upon reinspection a violation still exists, a reinspection fee for an additional \$50.00 will be charged along with the costs incurred by the Department of Public Works for snow and ice removal.

SNOW SHOVELING - SIDEWALK FRONTING PRIVATE PROPERTY

1. Complaints shall be taken by Police Department and/or any Public Works Office and then referred to the Neighborhood Enforcement Division. Sidewalk inspections are the responsibility of the Neighborhood Enforcement Division (NED).
2. The NED shall inspect the sidewalk of the property and, if in violation, a photograph shall be taken.
3. The NED shall then inspect the sidewalks abutting all properties on both sides of the street within that city block.
4. The owner of the property which is in violation of the ordinance shall be determined using the records of the City Assessor. A notice, including an inspection fee, shall be sent stipulating a date by which the sidewalk must be shoveled or, if the snow and ice is so hard that it cannot be removed, the sidewalk is to be strewn with sand or some other suitable material and kept strewn with sand or some other suitable material in accordance with Section 82-109.
5. Property owner is provided seven (7) calendar days from the date of issuance of notice to remove snow or to apply sand.
6. After seven (7) calendar days, the sidewalk shall be re-inspected by the NED.
7. If the sidewalk is found to be in compliance, the owner shall be invoiced for an inspection fee, and no further action will be required.
8. If the sidewalk is still found to be in violation, a second photograph shall be taken and the matter shall be referred to the NED.
9. NED staff will cause the snow to be removed and invoice the property owner for all costs including the original inspection fee, the re-inspection fee, and the cost of the work crew.

DPW - TRAFFIC DIVISION MANPOWER

The DPW - TRAFFIC DIVISION field manpower consists of the following:

2 Person Traffic Division

Depending on the type of snow storm and road conditions, either one or both of the Traffic Division employees may be needed for repair of regulatory traffic signs. If available, the second man is utilized as necessary for a snow plow relief operator.

A DPW supervisor will ensure the contractor tasked with plowing surface lots and ramps has completed their work in a satisfactory manner.

The two parking positions have been eliminated. All snow and ice control operations will be prosecuted by a private company contracted and managed by DPW personnel.

DPW - TRAFFIC DIVISION SNOW PLOWING RESPONSIBILITIES AND PRIORITIES

The DPW - TRAFFIC DIVISION has the responsibility of managing Four Season LLC in the salting, sanding, plowing and clearing the snow from all the parking system properties and the lot in back of Memorial Hall and the Library.

The properties under the parking system consist of 5 parking ramps and 24 off-street lots, which contain approximately 4170 total spaces, and the traffic and parking maintenance facility at 830 S. Racine Street. This division also maintains the interior and exterior sidewalks of all ramps and lots.

The Division's top priorities during snowstorms are to:

1. Repair regulatory signs (STOP, Yield, One Way, etc.) that are knocked down by accidents, wind etc., or repair signs that are a hazard to the public.
2. Manage Four Seasons LLC in the plowing/salting of the parking facilities maintained by this division.
3. Manage Four Seasons LLC in plowing/salting exterior sidewalks abutting the parking system properties.

The secondary priorities of the Division's operation are to:

1. Continue to maintain the regulatory signs etc. as stated above.
2. Continue to manage Four Seasons LLC in the plowing and clean-up lot areas that could not be plowed because of parked cars during the initial plowing operations and to widen driveways.
3. Ensure Four Seasons cleans interior sidewalks and metered islands.
4. Act as snow plow relief as needed and under the direction of the Street Maintenance Superintendent
4. Repair malfunctioning or damaged meters.

The final priorities of the operation are to work on establishing "normal" conditions by:

1. Continuing the maintenance of regulatory signs.

2. Continuing the maintenance, repair and collection of meters
3. Snow removal from parking lots as required.
4. Snow removal from parking ramps as required.

Section IX

Ordinances

Sec. 94-216. Declaration; duration.

There is hereby declared an emergency to exist in the city by reason of a heavy snowstorm whenever snow falls during any period of 24 hours or less to a depth of three inches or more, or has fallen in such manner as to produce a congestion of traffic, in that such storm constitutes a serious public hazard impairing transportation, the movement of food and fuel supplies, medical care, fire, health and police protection, and other vital facilities of the city. Such emergency is declared to continue for a period of 48 hours or until such earlier time as snowplowing operations have been declared completed by the commissioner of public works. (Code 1973, § 27.26.010)

Sec. 94-217. Parking prohibitions--Generally.

- (a) Whenever a snow emergency exists and the commissioner of public works shall cause an announcement thereof to be made by a radio station and/or television station whose normal operating range covers the city or shall cause publication thereof in the newspaper in general circulation in the city, no person shall park or allow to be parked any vehicle of any kind or description between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. upon any connecting highways (designated as state trunk highways) or upon any streets designated as arterial streets or collector streets as shown by the snow emergency map on file in the office of the city clerk, or upon any portion of a street that is in a parking meter zone.
- (b) On all streets not designated in subsection (a) of this section, parking shall be prohibited on the odd-numbered side of the street from 6:00 p.m. of a day before an even-numbered day until 6:00 a.m. of the next day and on the even-numbered side of the street from 6:00 p.m. of a day before an odd-numbered day until 6:00 a.m. of the next day; provided, however, vehicles may be parked for a period of time not longer than three minutes for actual unloading or loading of passengers or not longer than 30 minutes for actual unloading or loading of property where no other regulation restricting parking as to place or time is violated thereby.
- (c) The snow emergency map of the city may be revised by order of the commissioner of public works when the commissioner determines that a revision is in the public interest. Such revisions shall become effective upon publication in a newspaper as set forth in this section, and the commissioner shall file such revisions with the office of the city clerk.

Sec. 94-218. Same--Temporary prohibition; notice.

The commissioner of public works is hereby empowered to temporarily prohibit the parking of vehicles upon any city street from which snow is to be removed. Notice shall be posted along such streets not later than 4:00 p.m. on the day preceding snow removal and shall indicate the day of snow removal. No person shall park or suffer to be parked any vehicle of any kind or description upon any street so posted after 4:00 a.m. on the day indicated on such notice. Such notice shall be removed and the temporary prohibition ended by the commissioner of public works after the completion of snow removal.

Sec. 94-219. Removal of vehicles.

A vehicle of any kind or description parked in violation of snow removal or snow emergency regulations may be removed by towing to another area not a part of the snow removal or snow emergency area to an impound lot. Such removal shall be directed by the chief of police.

Sec. 94-220. Owner's responsibility for removal costs.

The owner of any vehicle removed from a snow removal or snow emergency area shall be responsible for all costs of towing, removal and storage. If the owner disputes the amount of these charges, the owner shall be entitled to an informal hearing at the police department.

Sec. 94-221. Provisions superseded.

Whenever a snow emergency is declared under this division, this division shall supersede and prevail over the provisions of section 94-145.

Sec. 94-145. Parking prohibited between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.; exceptions.


The operator or owner of any vehicle shall not park such vehicle between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any street in the city, except that this prohibition shall not apply to the following:

- (1) Any Saturday or Sunday morning excepting from December 1 to April 1 of each year;
- (2) Any holiday as designated in section 94-20;
- (3) Those blocks where parking is prohibited along one entire side;
- (4) The even-numbered side of any street on the morning of any even-numbered day;
- (5) The odd-numbered side of any street on the morning of any odd-numbered day;
- (6) Those blocks where parking is prohibited from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.;
- (7) Those blocks designated as cul-de-sacs; and
- (8) Those blocks within two blocks of a construction zone.



UNSHOVELED SIDEWALKS

WITHOUT PRIOR NOTICE THE CITY OF RACINE WILL ENFORCE UNSHOVELED SIDEWALK VIOLATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CITY ORD. 82-109.

Sidewalks: The owner of each parcel of real estate in the City abutting or bordering upon any street or other public place shall remove or cause to be removed all snow and ice from the sidewalk in front, along the side of, or adjacent to such premises to the full paved width of such sidewalk, within 24 hours after such snow or ice shall have fallen or accumulated thereon.

Use of Sand, etc: In case the snow and ice on the sidewalk shall be frozen so hard that it cannot be removed without injury to the sidewalk, the owner of every parcel of real estate shall, within the time specified in this Chapter, cause the sidewalk abutting or adjacent to such premises to be strewn and kept strewn with sand or some other suitable material, and shall as soon thereafter as the weather shall permit, thoroughly clean such sidewalk.

Sec. 82-109. Snow removal.

- (a) The owner of each parcel of real estate in the city abutting or bordering upon any street or other public place shall remove or cause to be removed all snow and ice from the sidewalk in front, along the side of, or adjacent to such premises to the full paved width of such sidewalk within 24 hours after such snow or ice shall have fallen or accumulated thereon.
- (b) In the case of snow and ice on the sidewalk which shall be frozen so hard that it cannot be removed without damage to the sidewalk, the owner of every parcel of real estate shall within the time specified in this section cause the sidewalk abutting or adjacent to such premises to be strewn and kept strewn with sand or some other suitable material, and shall, as soon thereafter as the weather shall permit, thoroughly clean such sidewalk.
- (c) The lessee, occupant or person having charge or, if there is no lessee, occupant or person having charge, then the owner of any building so located, abutting upon or near to any public street or place where snow or ice may fall from the roof thereof, into or upon such street or place, or upon the sidewalk thereof, shall cause all snow and ice to be removed from such roof within 24 hours after such snow and ice shall have ceased falling or forming or provide suitable guards so that ice or snow shall not be discharged upon the sidewalk.
- (d) In all cases where snow and ice have not been removed from the sidewalks and roofs, or in all cases of the neglect of the responsible person to spread sand or other substance upon snow and ice as required by this section, the responsible person may be cited for a violation of this section. The commissioner of public works shall be promptly notified of all violations of this section, whether or not a citation is issued, and shall proceed as provided in subsection (e) of this section.
- (e) The commissioner of public works shall keep an accurate account of the expenses of keeping the sidewalks clear of snow and ice in all cases where the owners or occupants of abutting lots fail to do so, and the expense of such clearing in front of any lot or parcel of land shall be reported and levied as a special tax against the same in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 66.615(5).
