BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING November 11, 2008 DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

DEPARTMENT: Environmental HealthREPORT FOR THE MONTH OF **OCTOBER**:

- The *Kenosha/Racine Lead-Free Communities Partnership* has completed lead abatement in 103 Racine homes and 91 Kenosha homes to date. The program has a goal of identify and controlling lead hazards in at least 200 homes in each community (400 total). Program referrals are strong and many properties are enrolled and in the process of being completed. The grant is also providing education and outreach for lead poisoning prevention.
- Lead poisoning prevention staff conducted lead screening at Head Start on Wednesday October 29th and Wednesday October 30th. A total of 160 children were screened for lead poisoning. Results are pending.
- Staff coordinated and participated in the "Make a Difference Day" Racine County Free Medication Drop Off held at the City of Racine household hazardous waste drop off site on Saturday October 18th. A total of 456 pounds of unwanted medication was collected and properly disposed of. In addition to the medication we recycled plastic bags, 118 pounds of plastic bottles, and 47.5 pounds of cardboard.
- Mr. Jack Aydelotte and Mr. Joel Matt presented the *RUSD Middle School Outbreak October 31*, 2007 at the southeast region Wisconsin Department of Agriculture agent meeting in Waukesha, Wisconsin on Thursday October 30th.

Outcome Achievements:

- Two hundred and seven (207) children tested for lead poisoning had blood lead levels between zero and nine ug/dL (0-9 ug/dL).
- Preliminary reports identify that ninety six (96) children were first tested for lead poisoning; two (2) had an elevated blood lead level (>9ug/dL), or 2.1 %.
- Preliminary reports identify two hundred and thirteen (213) children as being tested for lead poisoning; six (6) had an elevated blood lead level (>9ug/dL), or 2.8 %.
- The number of 2008 city dog licenses obtained to date is three thousand seven hundred and thirty three (3,733).
- The number of 2008 cat licenses obtained to date is eight hundred and twenty one (821).
- Eighty six (86) pet fanciers' permits have been issued in 2008.
