all forms and documents necessary, pay all fees, and take necessary action to undertake, direct, complete, and submit the supplemental grant application.

Fiscal Note: There is no cost associated with applying for supplemental funding. If awarded, the funds will be used by the City to loan to developers subject to a 20% funding match.

While costs will fluctuate from year to year, we will use 2022 to forecast a budget methodology for subsequent years.
