2026 Operating Plan for Business Improvement District No. 1, Downtown.

SUMMARY: The Downtown Business Improvement District seeks approval of its budget

and Operating Plan for 2026.

BACKGROUND: The Downtown Business Improvement District, No. 1 (BID No. 1) was established in 2001 for the purpose of redeveloping the downtown and as a mechanism to allow private property owners to work together with the City with the goals of safety, district improvements, and marketing tools for business growth. This year, BID No. 1 is requesting \$301,938 through special assessments - \$2.20 per \$1,000 of assessed value, which remains unchanged from last year's request — to help offset the costs of operating expenses including, but not limited to:

- Administrative Costs (Audit, Management of the BID, etc.)
- Program Operations (Promotion and Marketing, Public Service Outreach, Security, etc.)
- Capital Improvements (Maintenance, Street Amenities, etc.)

Further detail regarding the estimated costs and assessment calculations can be found in the attached 2026 Operating Plan created by the BID No. 1 and the 2026 Budget Presentation, also attached.

RECOMMENDATION: That the 2026 Operating Plan for the Downtown Business Improvement District, No. 1, be approved. Further that the Finance Director be authorized and directed to include the District's special charges on the 2025 property tax bills of the affected parcels.

FISCAL NOTE: It is estimated that \$301,938 will be raised through bid assessments that will be placed into the Downtown Business Improvement District's Revenue Account.
