- Group day care center. when operated within existing educational institution, recreation social facility. religious and institution.
- 9. Community living arrangements having a capacity of nine or more, excluding staff or live in family.
- 10. Parking lots and structures for the storage of private passenger automobiles.
- 11. Group day care centers.
- 12. Boardinghouses, lodging houses, and rooming houses.

- 13. Takeout-carryout restaurant as defined in 114-1(b).
- c. That all applicable permits shall be obtained from the Building Inspection department.
- d. That the following flex uses are permitted by conditional use permit via ZOrd. 003-16 in addition to those permitted in the B-1 Neighborhood Convenience District and amended herein:
- 1. Carpet and rug stores, retail sales only.
- 2. Hearing aid stores.
- Leather goods and luggage stores.
- 4. Orthopedic and medical appliance stores.
- 5. Locksmith shop.
- 6. Pet grooming.

- 2. The City is authorized by this Conditional Use permit to enter the site, implement the plans(s) and draw on the financial security for the cost of implementation if required improvements are not completed by the time of the issuance of an occupancy permit, or by an earlier date as may be required herein. Any costs incurred in excess of the value of the financial security shall be paid by the applicant or the owner or shall be imposed as a special charge against the real property in accordance with applicable statute.
- w. That by operating under this Conditional Use, the owner gives permission to the City to enter upon the property for the purposes described herein.
- x. That no minor changes be made to the conditions of this permit without the approval of the Plan Commission, and no major changes be made without the approval of the Common Council.

<u>Part 7</u>: To renumber the current subsection "(a)(5)" of Section 38-22. - Ambulance Billings of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine, Wisconsin to "(a)(6)."

<u>Part 8</u>: To renumber the current subsection "(a)(6)" of Section 38-22. - Ambulance Billings of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine, Wisconsin to "(a)(7)" and add the following new line item:

"\$65.00Oxygen"

<u>Part 9</u>: This ordinance shall take effect upon passage by a majority vote of the members-elect of the City Common Council and publication or posting as required by law.
