SUBJECT: Communication from the City Attorney requesting authorization to represent employees in the case of *Denwiddie v. Mueller, et al.*, U.S. District Court Eastern District of Wisconsin Case No. 2018-CV-601-JPS.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The City Attorney seeks Common Council authorization to represent an employees in the case of *Denwiddie v. Mueller, et al.*, U.S. District Court Eastern District of Wisconsin Case No. 2018-CV-601-JPS.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS: Four police officers, Stephen Mueller, Louis Aguilar, Glen Halberstadt, and Edward Ide are named as a defendant in this action arising from the execution of a search warrant in 2014.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 895.46, a municipality is required to defend or pay for the defense of any official or employee sued for acts taken in the conduct of official business and to indemnify such employee or official if any judgment is ordered. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 62.115, the common council of any city may by ordinance or resolution authorize the city attorney to defend actions brought against official or employee sued for acts taken in the conduct of official business.

It is more efficient and easier to control costs if the City Attorney's Office simply defends, or manages the defense of, lawsuits against City employees than to have an employee pay for her/his own defense and seek reimbursement.
