

**CITY OF RACINE AND RACINE WASTEWATER UTILITY JOINT SANITARY
INTERCEPTOR SEWER AGREEMENT**

This agreement is desirous of both the Racine Wastewater Utility and the City of Racine to provide efficient and cost effective services to the taxpayers and ratepayers of each entity.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Racine Wastewater Utility is desirous to have the City engineering staff work as it agent on the State DOT project on Durand Avenue (Highway 11) between Kearney and Kentucky where manholes may need adjusting and sewer lines may need lining..

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual provisions of this Agreement the Parties hereby agree as follows:

I. PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

A. The Racine Wastewater Utility agrees to:

1. Reimburse the City of Racine for all engineering and technician work necessary to prepare plans and specifications for the sanitary sewer work associated with the Utility's interceptor sewer system.
2. Pay for any and all inspection of the work including, manhole elevation setting and inspection of sewer lining work.
3. The Utility will also participate in a pro rata share of the costs of inspecting the paving work based upon square footage of responsibilities associated with the sewer trench if any open cut sewers are replaced.
4. The Utility shall reimburse the City for all bid items and changes in quantities associated with the bid items that the Utility is responsible for, upon being invoiced for said work from the City of Racine.
5. The Utility understands that bypass pumping may be required during pipe lining installation and is willing to pay for any and all costs associated with bypass pumping where required for the sanitary sewer lining or replacement.
6. It is anticipated that the costs involved will not exceed \$10,000

B. The City of Racine agrees to:

1. Waive any applicable street opening permits for work on this project.

2. Perform construction inspection and project management for that portion of work that pertains to sewer main construction, including the pavement restoration over the sewer main trench unless the State DOT or their agent provides this service at no additional cost to the City or Utility.

3. Review and recommend payment of all pay applications received from the contractor, and recommend monthly payments accordingly.

II. MISCELLANEOUS

A. Notices.

All notices, requests, demands, consents and approvals required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given when delivered personally or by FAX, addressed to the parties as follows:

B. Severability.

In the event that any provision of this Agreement, or any part thereof, is held or determined by a court or agency of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the balance of this Agreement shall be deemed to be severable and shall survive.

C. Successors.

This Agreement shall benefit and be binding upon the Parties and their Successors.

D. No Third-Party Beneficiaries.

This Agreement is intended to benefit only the Parties and their Successors, and nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted as giving to any Person which is not a Party any legal or equitable rights whatsoever
