Minutes of the June 8, 2010 meeting were approved as printed. Passed unanimously.

John Rooney noted the request to close Villa Street from 9th Street to 13th Street was this Saturday and would not have a chance for Common Council approval. He noted the group organizers would select another date later in the summer and resubmit the request.

Subject: Communication from Focus on Community requesting to use city right-of-way for a run/walk on October 2, 2010, from 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m., in conjunction with Party on the Pavement.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 6-29-10: That Focus on Community be granted permission to use

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city right-of-way for a run/walk on Saturday, October 2, 2010, from 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m., in conjunction with Party on the Pavement.

Further recommends that permission be granted with the following stipulations:

- A. A hold harmless agreement be executed.
- B. A liability insurance certificate be filed prior to this event.
- C. Any overtime costs incurred by any City department be charged to the sponsor.
- D. The sponsor shall notify all abutting property owners seventy-two (72) hours in advance of this event.
- E. The sponsor shall pay any costs associated with bagging of parking meters.

Further recommends that the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer and Chief of Police provide limited assistance, in the interest of public safety, to implement this event.

Fiscal Note: There will be nominal costs to various City departments, on a regular shift basis, to assist in implementing this event.

John Rooney explained the event by Focus On Community requesting to use City right-of-way for a run/walk on October 2, 1010 from 8:30 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. in conjunction with Party on the Pavement. He noted the event could be run on the Lake Michigan Pathway, along Pershing Drive and along the Lake Michigan Pathway fronting Festival Hall, Lakeshore Towers and Gaslight Pointe area. He noted the area of the run routed through Reefpoint Marina is under the jurisdiction of Racine County, and permission to use that facility would have to be requested by them. He noted their return route would take them down Main Street, Gaslight Drive and Lake Avenue back to Gateway Technical College. He noted the sponsor would be responsible for coning off the outside traffic lane along Main Street, Gaslight Drive and Lake Avenue. They would also be responsible for bagging meters to prevent any cars from parking on the east and north side of those streets where they wish to hold their run. He noted the event could be approved subject to a hold harmless agreement, liability insurance, and overtime costs incurred by any City Department be charged to the sponsor. He further noted they would need to pay for costs associated with bagging the meters, and if they elected to run on one-half of Pershing Drive for the start of the run, they would be required to detour the northbound traffic on Pershing Drive using Main Street from 11th Street to 6th Street.

After further discussion, a motion was made by DeHahn, seconded by Coe to approve. Passed unanimously.

John Rooney noted staff had no objections to the request as long as the usual stipulations were met for liability insurance and a hold harmless agreement, as well as any overtime costs being charged to the sponsor.

Mr. Gulan explained some of the hurdles he would have to overcome to secure insurance.

Staff noted that if insurance was not procured prior to the event and filed with the Attorney's Office, the event would not be allowed.

John Rooney asked that Amendment No. 1 on WISDOT Project ID: 2440-07-00/70 (STH20) Marquette Street to Main Street be approved in the amount of \$123,115.74. He noted the City's share of this amendment would be \$24,623.15. He noted the amendment is for the streetscape design of the roundabout, the expanded Paul Harris Plaza area, the Plaza in front of City Hall and all streetscape amenities for the length of the project. He noted this amendment is for the design of approximately \$625,000.00 worth of enhancements the City received through a transportation enhancement funding grant by the WISDOT. Funding will be provided in the 2011 CIP.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 6-29-10: The Common Council waive formal bidding procedures for the purchase of LED Street Lights, for the purposes of inventory management and ease of maintenance benefits, in the best interest of the taxpayers.

Further recommends that the Purchasing Agent be authorized and directed to negotiate with Beta-Kramer for the purchase of 122 three-bar and 22 two-bar LED light fixtures.

Fiscal Note: The estimated cost of this equipment is \$60,000.00 with funding available in Account 256.000.6010, Focus on Energy Rebates.

John Rooney read a communication from the Engineering Department analyzing the LED energy savings from high-pressure sodium. He noted the City measured energy savings from the high-pressure sodium fixtures that were changed out to LED fixtures through the two stimulus grants in the past seven months. He noted the energy savings by going to LED from 150W high-pressure sodium was approximately 60% and the energy savings from going from 250W high-pressure sodium was approximately 40%. He noted the City of Racine has received Focus on Energy rebates in the amount of approximately \$60,000.00. He asked that the Common

Council waive formal bidding procedures for the purchase of LED street lights and that the Purchasing Agent be authorized and directed to negotiate with Beta-Kramer for the purchase of approximately 122 three-bar and 22 two-bar LED fixtures.

Motion made by DeHahn, seconded by Coe to approve. Passed unanimously.
