7. Sidewalks abutting church properties for an estimated 100 blocks, or 18 miles of sidewalk (funds will most probably not be available for

these locations in 2016).

Perform concrete saw-cutting of vertical displacements between sidewalk squares where appropriate.

Perform sidewalk mud-jacking repairs and replacements via open-bid contract(s).

Use the experience and data garnered from the development and execution of the 2016 program to draft options and recommendations for the 2017 Sidewalk Maintenance Program to be presented to the Common Council as a portion of the 2017 budgeting process.

WHEREAS, the development agreement is for financial assistance in the form of a BC-RLF loan to the developer for the purposes of conducting environmental response activities at approximately 3.07 acres at 1520 and 1536 Clark Street for a multi-family residential development. The subject property is currently a large industrial building that requires environmental clean up and incentives to facilitate an historic, adaptive reuse of the property. The City views this development as a catalyst development within the Uptown Neighborhood Business Improvement District. Evaluation of the project financials show that this project cannot support additional direct debt to cover the extraordinary \$1.3 brownfield cleanup costs associated with this project; and

WHEREAS, the redevelopment will result in new 65 rental units targeted to low and moderate income veteran households, and nine market rate units; there is a veteran's preference for rental tenants, but non-veterans may also be tenants in the building; the total investment proposed by the developer is over \$18 million; the total resulting real property tax and personal property tax assessment from this investment is estimated to be \$2.4 million for the properties; and the proposed investments will Increase the taxable value by a factor of 587%; and

WHEREAS, the development has been reviewed and recommended for approval, with certain exceptions for vehicular parking and buffering, by the Racine Downtown Design Committee, and the City of Racine Plan Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City of Racine has engaged in negotiations for a development agreement to provide certain BC-RLF funding, conditioned on meeting certain performance and property tax requirements; and

WHEREAS, the \$580,000 BC-RLF loan is proposed to be repaid at 1% interest starting in 2022 by Tax Increment Finance District Number 19 as a TIF Incentive up to \$676,000 for such repayment including for capitalized interest. The payback period is 10 years; and

WHEREAS, City of Racine staff also recommends considering an optional TIF Incentive of \$75,000 of financial assistance through the BC-RLF to reimburse a subgrant fund for the development through the TIF District increment; and

WHEREAS, based upon staff's underwriting analysis of the project, the Developer's proposal meets City of Racine standards of project feasibility and long term sustainability. Legal staff, RCEDC staff, and City Development staff have both reviewed the proposed Development Agreement and the BC-RLF Loan proposal and believe that these incentives protect the City of Racine from any financial liability, yet facilitates a catalytic investment in the Uptown Neighborhood.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that a Development Agreement between the City of Racine; the Redevelopment Authority of the City of Racine; Herman and Kittle Properties, Inc; 1520 Clark Street L.P., and Wisconsin Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan, Inc. is approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor, City Clerk, and Director of City Development are authorized to execute the agreement, in substantially the form submitted, providing up to \$676,000 in financial assistance (including an optional \$75,000 of financial assistance to reimburse a subgrant fund) for the property at 1520 and 1536 Clark Street through the Brownfield Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund (BC-RLF). <u>Fiscal Note</u>: Funds were set aside within the Racine EPA BC-RLF this fiscal year in anticipation of a development called the "Veterans' Development" within the Uptown Neighborhood.

WHEREAS, the proposed CDC is to be called The Partnership because it is linking many established community organizations. Work on this organization has been occurring for well over a year. The founding organizations of this partnership include: Continuum of Care for the City and County of Racine (CoC), Great Lakes Community Conservation Corps (GLCCC), Homeless Assistance Leadership Organization (HALO), Housing Resources Incorporated (HRI), Human Capital Development Corporation (HCDC), Racine Housing and Neighborhood Partnership (RHNP) and Racine Neighborhood Watch, Inc. (RNW); and

WHEREAS, The Partnership's mission is to build a better Racine through the social, physical, and economic revitalization of our neighborhoods. The Partnership will be designed to meet HUD's definition of a "Community Housing and Development Organization" (CHDO) which will provide additional opportunities for grant and tax credit programs that the City cannot enjoy because we do not have a CHDO within our boundaries; and

WHEREAS, in order to begin its work, The Partnership requires monies to fund its activities, including staffing and administrative costs. These expenses were identified in the TID19 Project Plan; and

WHEREAS, City Development staff has reviewed The Partnership's proposal and recommends that the RDA fund the organization for this year at \$150,000. The TID19 does not yet produce increment, so staff propose to borrow money from the IGA account and reimburse the IGA account once TID19 begins producing increment.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the recommendation of the Racine Development Authority for a grant of \$150,000 to The Racine Revitalization

Partnership (The Partnership) to create a new Community Housing Development Organization is approved.
