RE: Snow Removal Regulations for Sidewalks and Crosswalks

On January 26, 2009 I sent the attached letter to the Department of Public Works. This was an attempt to have something done concerning the many residences in my neighborhood that had failed to clear their sidewalks and crosswalks of snow.

Dawn Lasnicka of the Department called me and explained that those residents who had not cleared their sidewalks were in violation of the city ordinances and many had already been cited for their failure. Dawn also told me that the ordinance only required clearing sidewalks to the curb line and her department was unable to demand any greater clearing. We both agreed that the ordinance isn't solving the problem that exists at the crosswalks.

With the heavy snows that Racine had received in December and January many of the crosswalks were blocked by piles of snow that ranged from three to four feet in height. In the middle of a city block that isn't necessarily a problem but it certainly is at the crosswalks. In our neighborhood we have grade school children trying to walk to Wadewitz. School. Every intersection is a challenge. Should they find a driveway and walk in the street to the next driveway on the next block? Should they climb the snow hill and risk falling while navigating the wall of snow? Yout Street and the others in this area are busy enough in the morning with parents of Wadewitz and Horlick students delivering their children. The extra traffic of small children trying to find a clear path to their school isn't safe and shouldn't be necessary either.

I would think the ordinances that govern the subject of snow removal should include the requirement that crosswalks be cleared of snow so that a clear path exists for pedestrians of all sizes and ages. I realize that this places an additional burden on those people who live on corner lots but it is something that needs to be addressed by the City of Racine.
