July 31 – August 1, 2012	Food and Drug Administration	Training on Risk Based Inspection Methods	This interactive workshop built upon concepts learned in Managing Retail Food Safety utilizing risk-based regulatory inspections. Case studies, role playing, and simulated inspection exercises were used to enhance critical thinking skills / techniques. Topics included: elements of a risk-based routine inspection, key terms, laws/policies/procedures, required equipment, food safety hazards, foodborne illness risk factors, key microbiological concepts related to risk-based inspections, communication techniques to more effectively motivate behavior change and strategies for prioritizing inspection time and flow. This was a positive experience and worthwhile training.
