Part 1:

Sec. 4-31(d) of the Charter Ordinances of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine is hereby amended by deleting the phrase ", on or before November 20" and inserting "at its second regular meeting of November" in its place.

Research was done and found that new vest, made with different material, worked well. Streicher, located in Wisconsin, is the only local vendor that is an authorized dealer for the new vests.

Janelle Grammer, Public Health Administrator, appeared before the Committee. The funds will be utilized for salaries and equipment for the Health, Fire, Police Departments, and possibly Emergency Management Services, to create an organization of "First Responders" of administrative managers to respond to a Pandemic Influenza.

Janelle is requesting an extension of the grant because the Health Department is requested to complete environmental assessments and clearance testing of homes that are earmarked as lead contaminated. The City has not completed the 60 homes a year that is required for the grant.

Janelle Grammer, Public Health Administrator, appeared before the Committee. The grant will be utilized to pay for a part-time student to pick up samples on the beaches for the testing of Campylobacter spp.
