Director's Report December 13, 2017

Board of Parks, Recreation & Cultural Services Play. Every Day.

The mission of Parks, Recreation & Cultural Services is to preserve our parks & open spaces and provide essential recreational programs & cultural services in a safe, professional & friendly manner.

Projects

Planning Stages:

- a) Ceiling Replacement Zoo Feline/Primate Building

Parks

Parks Division:

- a) Mulching leaves on all mowing routes.
- b) Finished installing snow fence in various Parks.
- c) Set up trucks and equipment for winter.
- d) Pulled piers for winter.
- e) Parks staff attended snow plow training at DPW (staff are backup for DPW).
- f) Started filling in sand play areas with new sand as required.
- g) Removed old play equipment at Hagerer Park and Grand Park to make room for the new items being installed.
- h) Spent an entire day with five staff members removing graffiti at Kids Cove Playground at North Beach. Estimate to clean it up is over \$2,000 of time and materials.
- i) Started doing some stump grinding. So far 32 stumps have been removed by Parks staff.

Forestry Division:

- a) The majority of the month was spent planting trees.
 - 267 bare root trees were planted along streets and in maintained portions of parks.

- 250 whips were planted in various forested park locations to replace ash trees removed due to emerald ash borer.
- b) Prescribed burns:
 - Olson Prairie: successfully burned.
 - Colonial Park prairie: did not burn well, we will mow instead.
 - Colonial Park piles: approximately 10 piles were burned; these piles were generated by volunteers removing invasive species.
 - Island Park: attempted to burn three small prairie restoration locations, relatively unsuccessful, follow-up mowing was completed.
 - Lincoln Park: attempted to burn one small prairie restoration location, relatively unsuccessful, follow-up mowing was completed.
- c) 20 trees were pruned (191 remain on the current list, 3,404 pruned to date in 2017).
- d) 15 trees were removed (163 remain on the current list, 755 removed to date in 2017); other removals occurred in forested portions of Colonial Park. Exact numbers are not available.

Recreation

Youth Programming:

- a) Over 100 youth and spectators attended the Youth Hoops basketball skills clinic.
- b) Snow Sharks has reached its enrollment goals and will proceed with the 15th season. The program is offered in partnership with Alpine Valley resort on alternating Monday and Wednesday evenings.
- c) Playground Planning has begun for 2018.

Adult Programming:

- a) Indoor Volleyball games are underway
- b) Basketball games started 11/2/17. We have 10 teams signed up. Games are at Chavez and Bryant Community Centers.
- c) Sent out Softball and Sand Volleyball Registration packets.
- d) Started recruiting for more umpires and sent out information to past umpires.

Miscellaneous Programming:

- a) Over 100 people attended the Make A Difference day Haunted House at CCCC on 10/27/17. Over 50 pounds of non-perishable food items were collected and donated to a local food bank.
- b) The Milwaukee Bucks have donated tickets to home games this season including upcoming games on 12/2/17 & 12/6/17.

Community Centers

King Center:

- a) On 10/8/17, staff took 13 youth to Chicago's Universal Soul Circus.
- b) On 11/8/17, staff and Ms. Teresa McMorris (MATC) distributed over 200 bomber jackets to local youth.
- c) Kingdom Builder's provides 50 lunches for staff to distribute to the youth every Monday, Wednesday, & Friday.
- d) Annual Christmas Community Dinner was held on 12/8/17 at 5:00pm. The community was treated with a light dinner and raffle prizes purchased through donations.
- e) King Center Quilters met for the first time Wednesday, 11/8/17. Ms. Holly will be providing basic sewing instruction, as well as needle point & crocheting.
- f) Tile flooring installation is completed in the entrance and main hallways.

g) Over the Thanksgiving Holiday, youth made boats out of paper cups and paper cup holder, a native necklace out of paper cup ring and fishing line and beads & a table top turkey out of a paper cup, poms and construction paper.

Humble Park:

- a) Eight PRCS Youth Hoops teams practice per week.
- b) Youth Hoops schedule 6 to 7 games on Saturdays with approximately 500 players/spectators.
- c) Special Olympics had their banquet with approximately 200 participants.

Cesar Chavez:

- a) Youth basketball clinic/camp was held on 11/4/17 with over 100 in attendance.
- b) Youth basketball games started on 11/11/17. Games are played on Saturdays at Chavez, Bryant, Humble and Tyler Domer Centers and Gilmore Middle school.
- c) WE Energies are holding Energy Assistance on Thursday evenings.
- d) United Healthcare held listening session on 11/14/17 with 25 seniors attending.
- e) New music lessons through Hispanic Roundtable group being held Monday Thursday.
- f) Approximately 30 teams practicing at Chavez for youth basketball weekly.


Bryant:

- a) Staff will host the Annual Christmas Party on 12/16/17 from 5:30-8:00 pm. Dinner will be served followed by entertainment from various center programs. - a) PRCS youth hoops started on 11/11/17 with 10 teams practicing per week and 6-7 games scheduled Saturdays. Approximately 500 players/spectators attend.
- b) There are 10 Youth Hoops teams practices a week
- c) Contacted Packers, Wave, Kingfish & Kwik Trip for prizes for bowling fundraiser. Flyers will be distributed at the 12/16/17 basketball games.
- d) Attended the WPRA Conference in Wisconsin Dells.
- e) Working on starting a pickle ball league on Mondays.
