1	Promote city/community ownership and pride; this requires a campaign under the leadership of several civic organizations galvanized by the healthy vision/goal for our City/community wellbeing. The process requires community input and approval to insure its acceptance and success; including all segments of our community, diversity.			
2	We need good paying jobs for the young people to keep them here. We do not do enough to bring in new Businesses we can not sustain on Art alone			
3	The City of Racine needs to adopt a vibrant, energetic and creative approach to the issues of commercial and residential development. There appears to be no strong vision of how the future looks or how to move efforts forward at a pace that will save the city, especially in the current economic climate. Racine cannot wait for Chicago investors to come North to save it. The city has not been able to invest it's residents in the vision of progress it is trying to develop. Too many natives are satisfied with status quo. Small steps over the last few years have given way to a sideways drift. More storefronts downtown are empty. No new building is being proposed. Existing mixed use space sits unfilled largely due to the perceptions of a largely poor unsafe city.

5	We've been too focused on transforming vacant land to industrial parks when there is no industry to be had. The city should be more open to other ideas. Case in point the old Jacobsen land on De Koven. A few years ago we had a party interested in a commercial development, including grocery, that we brushed aside in favor of an industrial park. There are no grocery stores of size in that entire southside area.			
	We also need to ditch the old ideas that foundries and manufacturers are going to one day reappear around here. Look to establish a new identity, bedroom community, artists' colony, harbor and winter recreation, whatever.
