32 33 34 35 36	<b>BACKGROUND &amp; ANALYSIS:</b> Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 895.46, a municipality is required to defend or pay for the defense of any official or employee sued for acts taken in the conduct of official business and to indemnify such employee or official if any judgment is ordered. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 62.115, the common council of any city may by ordinance or resolution authorize the city attorney to defend actions brought against official or employee sued for acts taken in the conduct of official business.
37 38 39 40	It is more efficient and easier to control costs if the City Attorney's Office simply defends, or manages the defense of, lawsuits against City employees than to have an employee pay for her/his own defense and seek reimbursement.
41 42 43 44	BUDGETARY IMPACT: The City Attorney's Office will handle the Brown, Hollimon, Progressive Insurance, Mitchell, Reed, and Shukar cases in-house. The Fagan case will be handled by retained, CVMIC-authorized outside counsel. The Bers and Jackson cases will be handled by attorneys retained by Transit Mutual Insurance Company.
