REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF: October, 2008

Highlights:

Flu Clinics: per Teri Hicks

Four flu clinics were held during the month of October.

Employee:

* Tuesday, October 7th – Employees (Health, Fire, Police)

* Monday, October 13th – All City Employees

Total: 255 employees served during above clinics, immunization clinic, and NOD appts. Community-based:

- * Monday, October 27th Village of Elmwood Park 14 seen
- * Thursday, October 30th Village of Wind Point 14 seen

Flu shots became available to the public on Tuesday, October 14th during our immunization clinic. Thus far we have provided the following number of flu shots to the public in the following fashions:

- * Immunization clinic: 103
- * Nurse of the Day (NOD): 22
- * Homebound: 9

Shots will be available until supplies last. Clients will be able to obtain the immunization at clinic or through an appointment with our Nurse of the Day. We accept Medicaid, Medicare (No HMOs) and cash. The cost is \$25/shot. An additional community-based clinic will be held on Thursday, November 6th at The Danish Home; approximately 10 clients will be served.

Transitional Living Services Health Education: per Bobbi Fergus and Kim Wagner

On October 29, 2008 a program regarding nutrition was presented to a group of behavior health individuals. This program was presented at Transitional Living Services on Douglas Ave. Approximately 20 people were in attendance. The program included lecture, discussion, and activities; models were used to reinforce the information presented. At the end of the lecture, clients were asked to develop a meal that was healthy to eat using the teaching models. Several sessions of food bingo were played; this resulted in interaction between the clients and nurses. The next education session is scheduled to occur on November 19th at 10:30am. The audience has requested us to present on the topic of "healthy beverages".
