Through collaborative efforts the Splash Pad was reopened on July 2, 2010. Discussions will continue to determine how long term operational / mechanical and community needs can be met. Daily monitoring of the site will continue.</p> <p>The outcome of these communications was positive and concluded with a plan to reopen the Fountain / Splash Pad this season with potential further renovations for early spring of 2011.</p>
