Call To Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Approval of Minutes for the June 10, 2008 Meeting.

On a motion by DeHahn, seconded by Weidner, the minutes were approved as printed.

Subject: Communication from Godske Awnings & Textiles, Inc. requesting permission to install awnings over city right-of-way at 1439 N. Main Street.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 6-24-08: The property owner of 1439 N. Main Street be granted permission to install stationary, projecting awnings, as requested, with the stipulation that a hold harmless agreement be executed, in accordance with State Statute 66.0425, Privileges in Streets.

Further recommends that the property owner be charged a \$50.00 fee to cover administrative costs associated with filing this item with the

Register of Deeds office.

Fiscal Note: There will be no cost to the City of Racine.

Rick read the request and noted the Building Inspector had no objections.

On a motion by Weidner, seconded by DeHahn, the Committee approved the request subject to the usual stipulations.

Subject: Communication from the Mayordomia 2008 Committee requesting permission to use public right-of-way for a parade to commemorate the Mayordomia 2008 and Senor Tlacolula on August 30, 2008.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 6-24-08: That the Mayordormia 2008 Committee be granted permission to close Festival Park Drive from 5th Street to 6th Street, Sam Johnson Parkway from Festival Park Drive to Lake Avenue, and Lake Avenue from 6th Street to 5th Street, on Saturday, August 30, 2007, from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., for the Senor de Tlacolula parade.

Further recommends that permission be granted with the following stipulations:

- A. A hold harmless agreement be executed.
- B. A liability insurance certificate be filed prior to this event.
- C. Any overtime costs incurred by any City department be charged to the sponsor.
- D. The sponsor shall pay a \$400.00 special event fee.

Further recommends that the Commissioner of Public Works/City Engineer and Chief of Police provide limited assistance, in the interest of public safety, to implement this event.

Fiscal Note: There will be nominal costs to various City departments, on a regular shift basis, to assist in implementing this event.

Rick explained the route and noted the parade is from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. and is the same route as last year.

Globe is a subcontractor on two sewer lining projects and is also bidding on another one. Globe is asking an extension through the fall. Rick noted he had no problem with the extension.

Subject: (Direct Referral) Communication from the Purchasing Agent submitting bids for the underground utilities for the Boat Pump Out Station.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 6-24-08: That formal bidding be waived and that the bid of Wanasek Corporation, as submitted to the Purchasing Agent in the amount of \$44,226.00, be approved.

Further recommends that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to enter in an agreement with Wanasek Corporation for the work to install a boat pump out station.

Further recommends that funds are available from the following sources:

\$ 5,000.00 - Wisconsin Waterways Commission \$15,000.00 - Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Grant \$24,226.00 - Racine Harbor Commission per Resolution 08-1607 \$44,226.00 - Total

Fiscal Note: Funds are available as herein delineated.

John described the project and noted the original estimate was less than \$25,000 and given to the Purchasing Agent to solicit bids. The bids came in over budget and the low bidder was The Wanasek Corp. in the amount of \$44,226. The over run is primarily due to having to excavate out into the street to extend services. Electrical will have to come from the north side of Dodge and that increased the price as well. Funding for the project comes from grant money from the WDNR and the Wisconsin Waterways Commission. There is approximately \$82,000 in grant money for this project and the Harbor Commission will pay a share of the revenue from the boat pump out station. James Rooney noted he has spoken with the DNR and they may

fund up to 50% of the cost overrun for the project. The applications from the DNR have been sent to the Harbor Commission and he expects to receive financial assistance.

On a motion by Weidner, seconded by DeHahn, the Committee approved waiving formal bidding and direct the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into a contract with The Wanasek Corp. in the amount of \$44,226.
