E. PRESENTATION OF THE 2011 PROPOSED BUDGET BY MAYOR DICKERT

Mayor Dickert presented the budget to Council.

2011 Budget Address

President Coe, Aldermen and residents of the great City of Racine. I am proud to introduce the 2011 City Budget.

In this budget we are proposing aggressive measures to secure the resources to meet short term needs while laying the groundwork for our future; a future where Racine can be held as a standard of economy, environment and innovation. To set these standards we must diligently implement our plans to make the city more efficient, cost effective and a valuable partner to our businesses and residents.

We started this budget process by requesting our department heads come in with no increase in their operations budgets, which they did. For the second year in a row I promised a budget with no layoffs, no furloughs and no cuts in services. And for the second year in a row I am proud to say that we have delivered on that promise. We should all be proud of our staff and the department heads.

We are introducing a lean budget that maintains quality services to our taxpayers and does not add one more person to the unemployment lines. I want to thank Chairman Jim Spangenberg and the Finance Committee who worked to hold the line on spending and keep the city's finances in check.

As we began working on the budget we were immediately faced with a mandated increase in our retirement costs coupled with a cut in the shared revenue by the state. Both of which we had no control over, however, we remained fiscally responsible. Even with these cuts we were able to keep our levy increase to 1%.

While no one, including myself, is comfortable with an increase, we started this process much higher than we ended and that was due in part to good fiscal management, long term planning and no gimmicks. We have a responsibility to you the taxpayers and the future of Racine and I will not play politics with this or any other budget. We will remain fiscally responsible and loyal to the future of Racine.

As we prepare for the future we consistently find new ways to be leaner while providing quality services. I also want to thank the Unions and our workers who are partnering with us in these difficult economic times that our residents are facing, thank you for working with us. Department heads & Union reps. please stand.

I also want to thank the three Racine legislators who sit on the State's Joint Finance Committee. Especially, Senator Lehman and Representative Mason who worked hand in hand with the City to bring millions of dollars back to Racine for infrastructure projects that rebuilt Racine streets. These are your tax dollars working to improve your community.

I don't want the taxpayers or anyone to underestimate the difficulties we still face. There are going to be tough times ahead and we need to be vigilant and transparent in addressing them. One example is our health care costs. Ten years ago the city spent \$6 million for healthcare and now we are spending over \$17 million. We need to find a remedy to halt this growth.

Because of unfunded mandates and other cost which are out of our control, I look forward to working as a partner with the State Legislature to work through the State

budget I will be meeting with the next Governor in December to begin talks on how we can create a balanced budget without decimating city services.

I will be as blunt with you as I will be with the Governor - this budget is lean, there is no fat left to cut. This budget is introduced with no salary increases, no reductions in personnel and still meets the city's needs. I encourage the council to review the expenditures in search of any efficiency that we might have missed, but there is no room in the levy for additions without an offsetting decrease to match. The taxpayers cannot afford any more spending and I will not support it. I will veto any changes that result in an additional increase in the levy.

As difficult as this budget was, you can rest assured that we are already preparing for the future. First: The new Park Pride Committee, a Public/Private group has already met three times working towards making our parks the best in the country while not adding to the tax burden. I want to thank Alderman McCarthy and the entire Parks Committee for their creative thinking while working towards a greater Racine.

Second; our purchasing of LED lights for our street lighting was expected to save 40% of our electricity costs. We have exceeded that expectation and are looking at up to a 60% savings in electricity for our taxpayers. We are working harder and smarter with every dollar we have. We are also installing LED lights in our parking ramps - transforming dimly lit areas into a daylight experience!

In response to your requests, our Information Systems department has designed a new Website for residents, tourists and those seeking to locate in Racine. We continue to provide more information in an easy to use format.

To build a great city requires difficult and sometimes unpopular decisions. But we make those decisions, because it is the right thing to do for ours and future generations. One of the toughest decisions I had to make in my first year's budget was to introduce the recycling cart program. I reluctantly agreed to impose a \$10 fee to fund the purchase, which was the responsible thing to do! I would like to thank Alderman Helding and the Public Works Committee for their support on this initiative, as well as the council who bravely backed this decision.

I and many of the council stated clearly that if the people helped us by recycling more, any financial gain would be given back. Well, I am here to tell you that we are keeping our promise to you. You, the residents worked so hard to recycle that instead of paying the \$10 fee this year, we are cutting it in half to five dollars. Thank you for your efforts and please keep it up. The more you save the environment, the more you save yourselves.

While money is tight and our patience is thin, we must never forget those things that make us great and enhance our quality of life. So we are expanding on what we are doing in our parks, on our beach and along our bike paths. We are creating better playgrounds for our children and more entertainment for our adults to enjoy. We partnered with the State and Federal Governments to make our rivers better, cleaner and more attractive to tourists. Finally, we are working on an international level to protect the very water that makes us a destination city.

I want to thank President Coe and the Executive Committee, as well as the Aldermen that voted to approve the Joint Dispatch agreement last week, thank you. We have tackled the tough issues and we were able to bring the people of this county together to form a partnership that brings efficient services to our residents while allowing us to save taxpayer dollars at a time it is needed most. Joint Dispatch in Racine will soon be a reality.

I want to sincerely thank the officials from Caledonia, Mount Pleasant, Sturtevant, and the County that joined us at the table to finish a goal that was started 30 years ago. I also want to give special thanks to Administrators Tom Friedel, Mike Andreasan, Mark Janiak, and Tom Leback as well as Chiefs Whalen and Hansen and the other chiefs who made this happen. This was a historical team WIN and I am proud to sign the agreement.

This is just the beginning of the cooperation between our neighboring municipalities, we can and will continue to explore ways to save taxpayers' money while working together to create a better region for everyone.

In order for us to continue growth in this area, we need to bring jobs and opportunities to Racine. I have toured over 20 local companies and worked with them as a partner in their progress, finding ways to help them grow. Our efforts have led to an expansion of no less than three companies which has helped in our reduction of unemployment from 17.5 to 14% in just over a year. Working with our local industries, not getting in their way, is how businesses will continue to find opportunities for growth.

This is also true in our efforts to restructure our housing program. With 165 contracts recently let out and 350-400 workers on the job, we are aggressively taking back the south-side historic district by rehabbing and rebuilding homes, as well as stabilizing the neighborhood and putting Racinians back to work. It is an ambitious plan and cannot thank our Development Department enough for their efforts. We have received over \$3 million in federal funds to help us achieve these goals and we have also set up a structure of sustainability to reinvest the funds and keep our efforts going for years to come.

A big part of any future in Racine is the support of you the residents. Our coordinated efforts with the police and our local nonprofit groups have led to one of the lowest part 1 crime rates in over 30 years. We used federal funds and wise budgeting by our finance team to put 3 more patrol officers on the street fighting crime in some of the toughest areas of town. We now have beat officers and a new COP house at 16th & Phillips to serve the Uptown area and soon will have one on Jacato Drive giving the neighborhood back to the residents who deserve the right to live in peace with their neighbors. I want to thank Alderman Wisneski and the License and Safety Committee who are working hard to improve the quality of life in Racine.

We also look to prevent problems and that's why the work of The Mayor's Office or Strategic Partnerships has been building relationships and helping Racine's non-profit's to find capital sources of funding and become self-sustainable, all in an effort to serve more people with less city resources and greater efficiency. Thanks to Debbi Embry and her staff.

Together, we are moving into a brighter future together. With new partners, hope, and a dedication to a better community for our citizens, we worked with SC Johnson Wax to rebuild our Fountain downtown and double the number of back packs we handed out to our children this fall.

I have been blessed with great people around me and a new enthusiasm in this city. We have had our wins and a few challenges, but every challenge is just another opportunity to get better and re-examine the old ways of doing things. We will always strive forward, always work for the betterment of the city and never give up, because that is what you have hired us to do. And when people say it's luck, I respond with a quote from Thomas Jefferson who said "I'm a great believer in luck, and I find the harder I work, the more I have of it!"

I am presenting a budget that may not seem exciting and has no frills; but continues to provide the necessary services without significantly increasing cost to the taxpayers

Finally, I want to extend a sincere and heartfelt thank you to the Firefighters, Police Officers and DPW workers who, a couple of weeks ago risked their lives to save 17 people trapped on a Ferris Wheel in Downtown. Faced with a situation which could have ended tragically, the Fire Department, Police and DPW Workers displayed the kind of quick response and bravery which makes us incredibly proud as a city. Tonight we are honored to have a few of the individuals involved here, please stand to be recognized. We have with us the Battalion Chief, the Division Chief, as well as the A Shift Commander, also Chiefs Wahlen and Hansen. I would also like to thank Pvt. Andrew Stein who risked his life to secure the wheel hub. We owe all of you our thanks and gratitude. I would also ask everyone in attendance to join me in saying thank you.

ORDINANCE NO. 17-10

City Clerk

To repeal Secs. 66-616, 66-617, 66-618 and 66-619 and to recreate Secs. 66-616 and 66-617 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine, Wisconsin relating to Smoking - Prohibited.

The Common Council of the City of Racine do ordain as follows:

Part 1:

Sections 66-616, 66-617, 66-618 and 66-619 are hereby repealed, and Sections 66-616 and 66-617 of the Municipal Code of the City of Racine are hereby recreated to read as follows:

"66-616. Smoking Prohibited.

1. Adoption of State Law.

The city adopts the provisions of s. 101.123, Wis. Stats., regulating smoking except as otherwise provided in city provisions not in conflict with s. 101.123, Wis. Stats., or other statues or administrative rules.

2. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

City building as referenced in s. 101.123(2) (a) 8r, Wis. Stats., including the buildings' porches, exterior stairways, patios, entrances/exits and landings.

- a. *City building* as referenced in s. 101.123(2) (a) 8r, Wis. Stats., means a building, or portion of any building, owned or leased by the city including any enclosed walkway connecting city buildings or structures.
- b. *Enclosed place* means all space between a floor and ceiling that is bounded by walls, doors, or windows, whether open or closed, covering more than 50 percent of the combined surface area of vertical planes constituting the perimeter of the area. A wall includes any retractable divider, garage door, or other physical barrier, whether temporary or permanent. A 0.011 gauge screen with an 18 by 16 mesh count is not a wall.

3. Exceptions.

Prohibitions against smoking shall not apply to any of the following:

- a. A private residence.
- b. A room used by only one person in an assisted living facility as his or her residence.
- c. A room in an assisted living facility in which 2 or more persons reside if every person who lives in that room smokes and each of those persons has made a written request to the person in charge of the assisted living facility to be placed in a room where smoking is allowed.
- d. A retail tobacco store that has been in existence since June 3, 2009, and in which the smoking of cigars and pipes has been allowed.
- e. A tobacco bar that has been in existence since June 3, 2009, and in which the smoking of cigars and pipes has been allowed.

4. Penalties.

a. Any person violating the state prohibition against smoking in enclosed places or upon those unenclosed spaces identified in s. 101.123(d) and (e), Wis. Stats., shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$100 nor more than \$250, and upon failure to pay the forfeiture, may be subject to not less than 2 nor more than 5 days of confinement in the county jail or house of correction.

b. Any person in charge of property as defined in s. 101.123(1) (d), Wis. Stats., who violates the provisions of s. 101.123(2m) (b) to (d), Wis. Stats., shall be subject to a forfeiture of \$100 and, upon failure to pay the forfeiture, may be confined in the county jail or house of correction for a period of 2 days. No person may be held subject to more than \$100 total forfeiture for violations occurring on the same calendar day. For violations subject to the forfeiture provided in this paragraph, no citation shall be issued t9 a person in charge who has not received a prior written warning notice.

Sec.66-617. Smoking prohibited on city property.

1. Smoking prohibited upon unenclosed city property.

The commissioner of public works may designate unenclosed properties owned or leased by the city as areas where smoking is prohibited for the purpose of protecting and preserving the health and comfort of the public. However, the commissioner may not use this authority to place signs prohibiting smoking in unenclosed areas within any specific distance from the entrances to city-owned or leased buildings.

2. State signage requirements.

Signs setting forth the prohibition against smoking shall comply with requirements established by the State of Wisconsin Department of Commerce, if any, and shall include information reasonably sufficient to inform individuals of the physical area within which smoking shall not be permitted. It is a violation of this section for an individual, following warning by any city employee or by any member of the public, to continue smoking within the posted area.

Designation of outside smoking areas.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, any person in charge of a restaurant, tavern, private club or retail establishment may designate an outside area that is a reasonable distance from any entrance to the restaurant, tavern, private club or retail establishment where customers, employees, or persons associated with the restaurant, tavern, private club or retail establishment may smoke as provided in s. 101.123(4m), Wis. Stats. governing local authority to regulate smoking on public property. Any person in charge of a restaurant, tavern, private club or retail establishment that designates an area for smoking which is a reasonable distance from any entrance to a restaurant, tavern, private club or retail establishment shall assure that the designated area is kept free of litter including cigarette butts or other tobacco products."
