21st to Grand, Grand to DeKoven Ave, DeKoven to Franklin, Franklin back to playground.

Please advise on how to proceed with this endeavor.

Hi Ms. Idstein,

All of your responses look good.

In regard to the sidewalks, I think that if you cross from the west side of Center Street, just south of Valerie Court, you could walk on the grass for Roosevelt Park; however, you should check with the National Guard Armory, to make sure that you can walk on their property—I would not think that they would have a problem, but this is their property, so you should okay it with them. I am also forwarding this to Parks, Rec., and Cultural Services to make sure that there are no problems with going through the park. You are not seeking sole use of the park, so I would think that this would be okay, so long as it does not conflict with other events; however, I cannot speak for them, which is why I am forwarding this to Director Tom Molbeck for him to weigh in on this permission.

Other than that, I believe that you have this well in hand. As long as you control the number of participants you send at once, so they do not push out into the street or residents' yards, and as long as you have event staff to assist children with crossing the streets (and they abide by pedestrian-vehicle traffic laws and ordinances), I do not see a problem with this event. Please, make sure that you obtain permissions from the National Guard Armory and from Parks, Rec, and Cultural Services as well.

Would we be able to walk on the grass there until we get to sidewalks? I had wanted to avoid crossing as many streets as possible.

Will all of the participants start as one large group or will you send them in controlled waves to maintain the flow on the sidewalk so that participants do not spread out into the roadway or walk through residents' yards? We will do it in waves

Have participants been advised in advance that they will need to stay on the sidewalks and follow pedestrian/vehicle traffic laws and ordinances? I will advise participants of this when they sign up and the day of the event.

This is our first attempt at this type of event.
