Re: Amendment to Chapter 94 of the Municipal Code. – Traffic and Vehicles.

On behalf of Chairperson Alder Jones, DPW Staff recommends the proposed amendment to the City of Racine Municipal Code Chapter 94 Article III, Division 2 – Parking Regulations. More specifically Section 94-141 – No Parking Zones, Schedule F:

We would like to ADD the following item from section (1) No Parking At Any Time:

- Byrd Avenue, north side, from Ohio Street east 130 feet.
- Byrd Avenue, south side, from Ohio Street to Virginia Street.

We would like to DELETE the following item from section (3) No Stopping, Standing or Parking a Vehicle At Any Time:

- Byrd Avenue, north side, from 20 feet east of Roosevelt Ave. to 80 feet west of Roosevelt Ave.

We would like to DELETE the following item from section (9) No Stopping, Standing or Parking From 7:30AM to 4:30PM on any School Day Except School Buses:

- Center Street, west side, from Tenth Street south 350 feet.
- Tenth Street, south side, from Center Street west 250 Feet.
- Eleventh Street, north side, from Center Street west 250 Feet.
- North Wisconsin Avenue, east side, From Kewaunee St. South 150 Feet.
- North Main Street, west side, From Kewaunee Street to Barker Street.

We would like to DELETE the following item from section (20) No Parking 3:30PM to 6:00PM Monday through Friday:

- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive, west side, from State Street to West Street.

We would like to DELETE the following item from section (34) No Parking at Any Time Dec. 1st to Apr. 1st:

- Orange Street, west side, between West High Street and Lawn Street.

Please note that if committee and council agree, these changes can take effect immediately. There is no fiscal obligation for the City to amend the Municipal Code. If the Committee agrees, the appropriate action would be to approve the amendment to the Municipal Code as described.
