Whereas: the Universal Declaration of Human Rights continues to provide the basis for all international human rights laws designed to ensure that inherent rights are protected regardless of nationality, sex, national or ethnic origin, color, religion, language, or any other status; and

Whereas: the theme of the anniversary year is "Dignity, Freedom, and Justice for All," emphasizing Article 1 of the Declaration that states, "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights," and the responsibility to continue promoting respect for these rights and freedoms lies within each of us.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mayor Cory Mason, proclaim December 10, 2022,

Human Rights Day

and I invite residents of the City of Racine to join me in reaffirming the dignity, worth and fundamental rights of all people.
