13	EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:	
14	Masharaya Bostick filed a claim with the City	requesting \$50,000.00 for injuries allegedly arising

Masharaya Bostick filed a claim with the City requesting \$50,000.00 for injuries allegedly arising while she was seat-belted in the rear of a Racine Police Department vehicle on or about September 7, 2017. The City denies liability for these damages. As such, it is the recommendation of the City Attorney's Office that this claim be denied.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS:

 Claimant Masharaya Bostick, of 2021 West Boulevard, Racine, Wisconsin, filed this claim for reimbursement in the amount of \$50,000.00 for injuries allegedly arising while she was seat-belted in the rear of a Racine Police Department vehicle on or about September 7, 2017. On the date in question, Ms. Bostick was in police custody (for multiple illegal drug-related charges) in the back seat of a squad car wearing her seatbelt when the officer driving the squad car parked the vehicle and exited it without taking the vehicle out of gear. The vehicle subsequently rolled 15 to 20 feet forward at a rate of approximately 1 to 3 miles per hour, before the officer returned to the squad car and applied the break to stop it. At no point did the vehicle collide with anything.

Upon stopping the vehicle, Ms. Bostick made a "shrieking" sound, alleged that her left shoulder hurt, and subsequently stated that she had been involved in three car accidents in the recent past, which caused injury to her back. Although not requested by Ms. Bostick, the officer called a rescue squad, and

Ms. Bostick was transported via ambulance to All Saints Hospital, where medical staff examined and x-rayed her, found no visible injuries, and medically cleared her for release back into police custody.

The claimant's attorney submitted various medical bills totaling \$11,463.84, allegedly associated with the claimant's purported injuries. The only two bills directly related to the subject incident occurring on September 7, 2017 (from the Racine Fire Department and All Saints Hospital) were paid in full by Ms. Bostick's Wisconsin Anthem Medicaid insurance at no cost to her. Another bill was from a medical imaging service that was billed directly to the claimant's attorneys at no apparent expense to the claimant. The bulk of the claimed medical expenses were for physical rehabilitation services that the claimant began receiving in August 2017—a month *prior* to the date of the incident in question. The remaining \$38,536.16 of the \$50,000.00 in claimed damages is for alleged present and future pain and suffering.

In order for the City to be liable for the claimant's injuries, the claimant must prove that the acts of the officer in question were a "substantial factor" in causing her injuries. Because the claimant has failed to demonstrate that the events on September 7, 2017 caused Ms. Bostick any actual physical or financial injury, the City cannot be held liable for the alleged damages. As such, the City denies liability for these alleged damages, and it is the recommendation of the City Attorney's Office that this claim be denied.

If the recommendation to deny this claim is rejected, and the Committee recommends that this claim be paid by the City (contrary to any indication of the City's liability for the alleged damages), this item would have up to a \$50,000.00 impact on the City's 2019 claims budget.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

The City Attorney's Office respectfully recommends that this Committee recommend denial of the claim of Masharaya Bostick to the Common Council.
