Illinois wishes to set up an initial rapid molecular capable laboratory as a demonstration project in Wilmette, Illinois. The group toured the Health Department Laboratory, observed the molecular procedure from start to finish and discussed capital equipment and physical space needs. This was a positive experience as it demonstrates Racine's leadership in this area. Our laboratory also had a visitor from Maine (June 9, 2010). As part of the Water Environment Research
