Mr. Sadowski summarized what occured over the last few months. He said that October 14 was the deadline to compile the minutes to approve a copy of the preliminary draft.

Commissioner Wyant opened the item for discussion and changes. Commissioner Marcus' and Mr. Sadowski's comments and changes were discussed. No other modifications were made.

Mr. Sadowski discussed what was being done to prepare literature for the public to find out about the plan (e.g. notices, setting up meetings, etc...). Mr. Sadowski explained the request for an electronic sign at Horlick High School to provide information on school events with no outside advertising. The request, as submitted, violates three of the Ordinance requirements. Other details were discussed.

Public hearing opened at 4:30 p.m.

Mr. Jon Klema spoke on behalf of Michael's Sign company. He explained why they chose the location, lighting, safety, and what works best for the school. Mr. Klema said that the lettering height approved by the City of Racine ordinance was too restrictive and tried to explain what "grade" meant to a sign company vs. the official planning definition.

A representative from Horlick's music department also spoke in favor of the sign.

A teacher (Victor) and student council advisor spoke in favor of the sign.

Public hearing closed at 4:49 p.m.

Ms. Johanneck explained the criteria for her decision. She was concerned with setting a precedence on the new sign ordinance by not requiring the applicant meet the criteria. The best review was done based on what was submitted by the applicant. She explained that the items were not modified because they did not meet criteria for variance. She said a landscape plan was also missing. Based on these

items, Ms. Johanneck recommended denial of the electronic low profile sign location for Horlick High School.

Commissioner Wyant questioned the letter height and why it was applied. Ms. Johanneck advised that, in writing the ordinance, she looked at communities who did electronic signs well. She said as the speed limit increases, so does the allowable sign lettering.

Commissioner Sutton-Ekes asked if this application would go to Council for final approval. Ms. Johanneck advised yes. (The remaining comments were inaudible).

Mr. Sadowski advised there is an appeals process through either the Plan Commission or the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Commissioner Marcus noted he was concerned with safety, especially in school zones.

Victor, from Horlick High School, came forward to speak on why the sign should be where it was proposed and offered other comments (most of the discussion is inaudible on tape). Commissioner Wyant reminded that the public hearing was closed and this discussion ceased.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marcus, seconded by Commissioner Sutton-Ekes, that this item be tabled to allow staff and the applicant to work together for alternate solutions regarding the electronic sign. The motion PASSED by a Voice Vote.

Mr. Sadowski introduced the lot at 1801 Quincy Avenue as a contractor's yard and equipment maintenance facility. Slides were shown and zoning identified. Parking areas, driveway areas, paved and gravel lots and surrounding properties were also identified.

The applicant came forward to discuss changes he would be making to the site. He advised that though this is the same site plan used months ago for a different use, it was modified to meet their use. He said there will be no equipment repair, painting, etc... Just general maintenance for their vehicles only.

Public hearing opened at 5:10 p.m.

Matt Winterly, 1817 Quincy Avenue, spoke in opposition. He had concerns about a drainage issue. Ms. Johanneck said that he may want to work with Public Works regarding the drainage.

Carol Bousch, 1947 Quincy Avenue, spoke in opposition. She had concerns about the traffic.

Commissioner Wyant requested comment from the applicant regarding drainage. Mr. Beardsley acknowledged the drainage problem and advised he would be able to correct it. He also advised truck traffic would be once or twice a day and no daily hauling would occur.

Public hearing closed at 5:30 p.m.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sutton-Ekes, seconded by Commissioner Marcus to recommend approval of this request subject to staff conditions as modified. The motion PASSED by a Voice Vote.

Subject: (Direct Referral) A request by Jeffery Urquhart for a conditional use permit for a group home primarily serving teen fathers and teen boys, eight or fewer, at 1900 Grand Avenue.

Recommendation of the City Plan Commission on 11-25-09: To deny the request.

Mr. Sadowski discussed the application as submitted for a group facility at 1900 Grand Avenue. The floor plan was also reviewed.

Ms. Johanneck advised that, though the 1% verification has not been completed, the number of those assisted was not even close to 1% of the Aldermanic District population. She noted the proposed CBRF does lie within a state required 2,500' rule, which applies to CBRF's as a distance requirement. The distance requirement can be overridden by Common Council if deemed acceptable. The plan was reviewed and approval subject to conditions was recommended.

The applicant, Jeffrey Urquhart, came forward to discuss the proposal. He said the goals and objectives would be job training, transitional housing, teaching young men life skills, getting kids involved in positive activities, providing training for teen fathers, etc... There would be two managers on site 24/7. A social worker would be available at all times. He said they would work on getting kids back in school and keeping kids busy so they aren't idle with time on their hands to do other things.

Public hearing opened at 5:43 p.m.

Pam Ishman, 1908 Grand Avenue, spoke in opposition and is concerned about arson that occurred about two years ago and about vandalism and tagging of garages. She wanted to know the background of the occupants and applicants who would be running the house.

Kathy Stege, 1904 Grand Avenue, spoke in opposition. She is concerned about noise, vandalism, parking, and doesn't want this next door to her. She referred to the project as a "halfway house".

Barb Pinnow, 1920 Grand Avenue, spoke in opposition. She wanted to know why the juvenile fathers were not with the mother and the baby. She thought this should be

closer to a high school. She had questions on the length of stay; wanted proof the kids are the actual fathers of the babies; thought the yard was too small; was afraid this would be a gathering place; and wanted information on the ages and history of the tenants. She felt the 2,500' rule should be enforced.

Carolyn Cotton, 717 DeKoven Avenue, spoke in opposition. She lives directly behind the property and was concerned about safety. She had various questions for the applicant.

Audrana Prince, 1921 Center Street, spoke in opposition. She is concerned about vandalism and had the same comments as others that spoke before.

Rachel Pezanoski, 1912 Grand Avenue, spoke in opposition. She is concerned about graffiti, noise and disturbances.

Vincente Reynoso, 708 DeKoven Avenue, spoke in opposition. He noted concerns for kids in the neighborhood and their safety.

Public hearing closed at 6:25 p.m.

The applicant came forward to answer questions of various Commission members.

Alderman Anderson was not present, however, Commissioner Marcus relayed his concerns of the experience of those running the program and if there would be some sort of neighborhood advisory board. The applicant provided detailed information on his and his wife's qualifications to run the center. He said there would be a six member board.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sutton-Ekes, seconded by Commissioner Marcus, that this item be deferred to allow staff and the applicants to work together to provide more information to the Commission members and neighbors who spoke on the item. The motion PASSED by a Voice Vote.
