6/23/10	Healthy Foods Workshop for the Racine Healthy Births Healthy Families Program	The Workshop objectives were to educate moms on: the benefits of breastfeeding, teach families how to make nutritious baby food, and to encourage healthy eating, the use of Farmer's Market coupons through WIC.	Seven adults, five infants, and five children attended the workshop. The families were observed eating the salad and stated they would make the fruit salad at home. Many families stated that they are going to be using the Farmers Market for fresh foods to start to eat healthier daily. Participants completed an evaluation at the end of the workshop. All feedback received was positive.
