Mary Hargrove and some neighbors from the 1900 block of Lindermann appeared before the committee. They noted the lighting system in that area seems to not illuminate the area and they also noted there were limbs and trees that obstructed some of the lighting as well. John Rooney noted some of the problems with the street lighting budget and the cost to increase lighting either by wattage of the fixtures or adding lights. He noted if the committee wanted to defer the item to gather some information on it. Alderman Marcus and Alderman Shields suggested that a representative from WE Energies appear before the committee at the next meeting to discuss what could be done from their end as far as upgrades that would perhaps reduce costs.

Recommendation of the Public Works and Services Committee on 7-12-11: That the mosiac design for the West 6th Street Bridge be approved, as submitted.

Fiscal Note: Previous approval was granted under Resolution 11-6045, dated April 18, 2011, with the stipulation that they present final plans, that met the criteria, when completed.

Ben Lehner appeared before the committee and provided some sketches of the mosaic that were to be placed on the bridge between Marquette St. and Mound Ave. He described the mosaic project as a 600 ft. long band on both sides of the bridge approximately 18 inches in height that would be on the walls of the bridges and next to the sidewalk. John Rooney noted the stipulations that were in the policy that was approved this past Spring by the Public Works and Services Committee and the Common Council. John Rooney noted that it would be important that Mr. Lehner meet with him to approve the location of the mosaic tiles and that documentation be received from a registered professional engineer showing the installation and material method used for the mosaics. He also noted that the City's Attorney's Office should be contacted for the hold harmless and liability insurance requirements as well. Motion made by DeHahn, seconded by Mogenroth to approve. Passed unanimously.
