Approval of Minutes for the August 12 and 26, 2009 Meetings

Matt Sadowski provided an overview of the request and advised the item has been recommended for approval by the Access Corridor Committee. Mr. Sadowski advised that there is abundant off-street parking available in public lots.

The applicant, Gerald Bester, came forward to discuss the hours and request a change to what was recommended for approval by Access Corridor. Due to the potential addition of a coffee house, he would like to open at 7:00 a.m.

Mayor Dickert asked Mr. Bester if the deck off the back of the second floor will be utilized and if it has been checked to verify it meets building and fire codes. Mr. Bester advised he is planning to use the second floor deck and will be getting all inspections within the next few weeks. Mayor Dickert advised there is a fire escape off the back and to watch out for people exiting/entering the area with alcohol. Mr. Bester advised that at this time the deck area would be used only as a smoking area.

Mr. Sadowski read the recommended conditions of approval into the record. Mr. Bester asked if he could get permission to have alcohol outside in this area. Mayor Dickert advised there may be issues with having alcohol outside on the deck and depending on the terms of his liquor license. Rick Heller advised the liquor license explains exactly where liquor can be sold, served, etc... so it depends on how his license is written.

Mayor Dickert noted the applicant will have to go back to the Access Corridor Committee if there is a desire for expanded use of the second floor deck. He and Alderman Helding advised the ACDRC is an advisory committee and will not hold up the current process for the applicant.

Commissioner Sutton-Ekes felt that adding language to f. such as "the second floor deck area shall be used in accordance with any alcohol licenses obtained from the City" could clear up the issue and govern what goes on with the deck.

Modifications to the conditions of approval are as follows:

Change f. to: That plans for the future use of the outdoor patio area be submitted to the ACDRC for review and approval prior to implementation. The second floor deck shall be used in accordance with any alcohol licenses obtained from the City.

Change e. to: That the days and hours of operation be Monday through Wednesday, 7:00 a.m. – 11:00 p.m., Thursday from 7:00 a.m. to close, and Thursday through Saturday 7:00 a.m. to close.

Commissioner Marcus recommended an additional condition requiring that there be a full-sized kitchen installed and maintained in the establishment. Some individuals and the applicant felt this was a duplicative request as it is required with the liquor license.

Commissioner Marcus moved to approve the request, with the inclusion of the modifications made, the pending inclusion of the changes and incorporating the alcohol statements as discussed above into the applications. Seconded by Commissioner Esqueda. Upon a voice vote, two were for and two were against, with Commissioner Wyant abstaining. Mayor Dickert advised he would vote no.

A motion was made by Alderman Helding, seconded by Commissioner Sutton-Ekes, that this item be approved subject to the recommendation of the ACDRC. The motion PASSED by a voice vote with Commissioner Wyant abstaining.

Mr. Sadowski corrected the title from "food" to "foot". He reviewed the proposal and the location within the mall. An interpreter spoke on behalf of the applicant to answer questions. They will not give manicures or pedicures and estimate up to 20 customers per day. It will be massage in a massage chair or a table screened by a sheet or divider. The proprietor has a location in Fond Du Lac for approximately two years. He is state and nationally certified.

Curt Pruitt, General Manager of the mall, spoke advising there will be a menu of services for clients to choose from. He reiterated this will be a clothed table or chair massage with dividers, if requested.

Mr. Sadowski reviewed a summary of Plan Commission comments, corrections and clarifications found in the document titled "City of Racine Comprehensive Plan Notes; from the Plan Commission meeting of August 26, 2009". This document pertains to Chapters 3 Trends and Projections and Chapter 4 Issues and Opportunities [the listing of comments corrections and clarifications is made part of these minutes by separate document and attached to this file (09-3201)].

Commission members continued discussion on Chapter 3 by reviewing the explanation provided by SEWRPC describing the method(s) used to arrive at population and housing projections [said SEWRPC explanation made part of these minutes by separate document and attached to this file (09-3201)]. Members expressed concern with a lack of disclosure regarding the key assumptions employed in the development of the projections. Commission members requested that further explanation be obtained.

It was moved by Commissioner Marcus and seconded by Commissioner Ekes to defer on Chapter 3. Motion approved. All ayes.

It was moved by Commissioner Marcus and seconded by Commissioner Ekes to approve the draft of Chapter 4 subject to changes as addressed in the document titled "City Of Racine Comprehensive Plan Notes; from the Plan Commission meeting of August 26, 2009", and changing the word "Goals" in the title of the section beginning on page 9 to "Implementation Strategies". Motion approved. All ayes.

Commission members agreed to begin work meetings during the noon hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays. At these meetings Comp Plan Chapter reviews would be conducted. Staff will conduct the review with those members who are able to attend.
