Mr. Snow,

Since 2006, the Root River Council (RRC) has been partnering with area non-profits, businesses, civic groups, and government agencies to revitalize the Root River in Racine. The activities undertaken all aim to improve water quality, promote economic growth, increase public access to the Root River, and create a sense of place.

In partnership with the Racine County Heritage Museum, the Root River Council aims to revive a long forgotten Racine tradition: the Chautauqua. The Chautauqua's were popular in the turn of the last century, with the Racine Chautauqua (c. 1903-1928) held at 'Kinzie Heights' current site of McKinley Middle School. The RRC aims to reintroduce Racine to this cultural festival in September 2011.

The RRC would like to propose hosting this weekend festival (9-23-11 to 9-25-11) at Island Park with one day of activities along Horlick Park Drive south of the W 6<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge. This festival would require one large tent 30X60', and several smaller tents. In true celebration of Racine past and present heritage, on Saturday Sept 24, the RRC would also like to host a horse show complete with horse rides for the public.

I have attached a proposed festival schedule, but would like to share some more information with you and members of the Parks Board at your earliest convenience to ensure enough time for planning. I think the Root River Chautauqua Festival will be a widely celebrated event and look forward to discussing this in further detail.


