WHEREAS, the celebration begins on September 15, marking the anniversary of independence for Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua, followed by Mexico's Independence Day on September 16 and Chile's on September 18, reflecting the shared spirit of freedom and resilience across Latin America; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 national theme, "Collective Heritage: Honoring the Past, Inspiring the Future," celebrates the enduring legacy of Hispanic communities and their leadership in shaping the social, political, and economic fabric of our city, state, and country; and

WHEREAS, Hispanic and Latino Americans continue to enrich Racine through their roles as entrepreneurs, educators, artists, public servants, and community advocates. From serving in the U.S. military to leading movements for equity and justice, they remain powerful changemakers and cultural stewards.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Cory Mason, Mayor of the City of Racine, do hereby proclaim September 15 through October 15, 2025, as HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH in the City of Racine, and I encourage all residents to celebrate the vibrant contributions of Hispanic and Latino communities, foster equity, and build lasting alliances that strengthen our shared future.
