*Whereas:* September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for the Latin American countries of Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua; Mexico celebrates independence day on September 16, and Chile celebrates independence day on September 17; and

*Whereas:* this year's theme of Hispanic Heritage Month is, "Latinos: Driving Prosperity, Power and Progress in America" bringing attention to the significant strides of Hispanics in the social, political, and economic growth in our city, state, and country; and

*Whereas:* Hispanic and Latinx Racinians represent an array of distinct and vibrant cultures, and we honor their important contributions to the cultural fabric of our city throughout the entire year, but especially during this month; and

*Whereas:* Hispanics of all generations as well as recent immigrants continue to have a profound impact on our community through their strong commitment to family, faith, hard work, and service.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, Cory Mason, Mayor** of the City of Racine, do hereby proclaim September 15 through October 15, 2023, as:
