Re: Amendment to Chapter 94 of the Municipal Code. – Traffic and Vehicles.

On behalf of Chairperson Alder Maack, DPW Staff recommends the proposed amendment to the City of Racine Municipal Code Chapter 94 Article III, Division 2 – Parking Regulations. More specifically Section 94-141 – No Parking Zones, Schedule F:

We would like to EDIT the following items from Section (1) No Parking at any time:

- From: North Main, west side, from 80 feet south of Goold to 200 ft north of Goold Street.\*
- To: North Main, both sides, from 250 feet south of Goold to 200 ft north of Goold Street.\*
- From: North Main, east side, from 200 feet south of Walton Ave. to Romayne Avenue.\*
- To: North Main, east side, from 200 feet south of Walton Ave. to Melvin Avenue.\*
- From: North Main, west side, from Melvin Avenue to South Creek Road.\*
- To: North Main, east side, from Melvin Avenue to South Creek Road.\*(not entered correctly)

We would like to ELIMINATE the following items from Section (8) No Parking from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on any school day:

- LaSalle Street, east side, from Romayne Avenue south 400 feet.\*
- Romayne Avenue, south side, from LaSalle Street to Superior Street.\*
- Superior Street, west side, from Romayne Avenue south 150 feet.\*

We would like to EDIT the following item from Section (9) No Stopping, Standing or Parking from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on any school day except for School buses and mass transit vehicles owned and operated by the city:

- From: Gillen Street, north side, from 100 feet east of Drexel, east 300 feet.\*
- To: Gillen Street, north side, from 10 feet east of Drexel, east 170 feet.\*

We would like to ELIMINATE the following items from Section (9) No Stopping, Standing or Parking from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on any school day except for School buses and mass transit vehicles owned and operated by the city:

- Mitchell Street, south side, from Drexel Avenue, east 400 feet.\*
- Superior Street, west side, from 120 feet south of Romayne Avenue south 130 feet.\*

16<sup>th</sup> Street, north side, from Perry Avenue to Ohio Street.\*\*

We would like to ELIMINATE the following items from Section (20) No Parking from 3:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday of each week:

- North Main Street, east side, from Romayne Avenue to 100 feet north of Jonathan Drive.\*
- Superior Street, west side, from 120 feet south of Romayne Avenue south 130 feet.\*

We would like to ELIMINATE the following item from Section (32) No Parking from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. from May 1 to September 30 of each year on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays only:

 North Main Street, west side, from Walton Avenue to Romayne Avenue and Walton Avenue south 360 feet.\*

We would like to ADD the following item from section (46) No Parking, Loading Zone from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on any school day:

Mitchell Street, south side, from Drexel Avenue, east 400 feet.\*

We would like to ELIMINATE the following item from section (46) No Parking, Loading Zone from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on any school day:

- Mitchell Street, south side, from 400 feet east of Drexel Avenue to Ashland Avenue.\*\*
- \* Denotes change from what was found in Municipal Code
- \*\* Denotes change from what was found in the field

Please note that if the committee and council agree, these changes can take effect immediately. There is no fiscal obligation for the City to amend the Municipal Code and only a nominal fee to produce the regulatory signs. If the Committee agrees, the appropriate action would be to approve the amendments to the Municipal Code as described.
