### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Department of City Development – Division of Housing and Community Development requests that the Community Development Committee review 2017 CDBG applications and staff funding recommendations.

### **BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS:**

The 2017 Annual Action Plan was approved by the Community Development Committee on July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017 (Attachment A), and is scheduled for final action by the Common Council on August 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017. Funding in the 2017 Annual Action Plan determines the amount of CDBG funding available by category.

A Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for CDBG was released on June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017 for CDBG funding categories: Public Infrastructure, Public Services, Economic Development-Microenterprise, and Economic Development- Job Training. CDBG funding in these categories is competitive and open to all qualified organizations. Application materials were due to the Department of City Development on July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

All CDBG applications received by City Development were reviewed by staff members Laura Detert (Manager of Housing and Community Development), Ben Lehner (Community Development Program Specialist), Brendan Saunders (Community Development Compliance Specialist), and Joy Hansche (Accountant).

Attached is the staff funding recommendations for CDBG funding. (Attachment B) The Community Development Committee recommends allocation amounts to the Common Council and may alter the allocation within HUD guidelines.

Per Community Development Committee tradition, all applicant organizations have been invited to speak for up to three minutes and distribute written materials to committee members at the beginning of the meeting and before the allocation vote.

## **BUDGETARY IMPACT:**


\$978,698 of Community Development Block Grant funds are available for allocation.

To allocate CDBG funds to organizations as indicated by staff, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to enter into contracts with the organizations pursuant to the funding allocation and federal regulations.
