BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING February 10, 2009 DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

DEPARTMENT: Environmental Health

REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY:

- January 15, 2009, the Racine Health Department was notified by Countryside Humane Society of a complaint they received regarding Aquatic Oddities pet shop located at 1302 Grange Avenue in the City of Racine. Complaint alleged poor condition of several animals and possible dead animals on the premises. Arrangements were made with Humane Society personnel and Health department staff to conduct a joint inspection on Friday January 16th. At that time, the complaint was verified noting several dead reptiles, several reptiles with little or no water and insufficient food. The owner did cooperate and surrendered all animals and his pet shop license. The Humane Society worked with several rescue groups to place all animals. We are currently working with the City Attorney and the District Attorney to finalize charges.
- January 19, 2009 the Racine Health Department was notified of a bat bite that occurred in a bedroom of a residence. One individual was bitten. The bat was captured and euthanized on the same day. The bat was sent by health department staff to the State Lab of Hygiene rabies unit where it tested positive for the rabies virus. The victim was started on rabies prophylaxis and several household members are also undergoing treatment. An unvaccinated cat in the residence is quarantined for observation for a period of 180 days.

Outcome Achievements:

- Two hundred and thirty (230) children tested for lead poisoning had blood lead levels between zero and nine ug/dL (0-9 ug/dL).
- Preliminary reports identify that ninety four (94) children were first tested for lead poisoning; one (1) had an elevated blood lead level (>9ug/dL), or 1.1%.
- Preliminary reports identify two hundred and thirty four (234) children as being tested for lead poisoning; four (4) had an elevated blood lead level (>9ug/dL), or 1.7 %.
- The number of 2009 city dog licenses obtained to date is two thousand three hundred and seventy eight (2,378).
- The number of 2009 cat licenses obtained to date is six hundred and eleven (611).
- Sixty seven (67) pet fanciers' permits have been issued in 2009.
