Research has shown a significant correlation between the occurrence of intense stress and childhood trauma, and an increased chance of a wide range of long-term health and economic outcomes later in life. LSS is committed to finding creative ways to intervene with youth before childhood trauma can adversely impact their future. LSS proposed Mural Healing project will endeavor to identify youth who may be at risk for criminal justice system involvement due to unaddressed Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs). Youth will have the opportunity to explore healing trauma through creative self-expression. Youth will work in small groups with the support of a professional artist, a therapist, and a staff from the Racine Police Department-Community Oriented Policing will allow youth to heal while developing skills that help them more effectively communicate with others to achieve a common goal.
