on September 13, 2022. Upon inspection, no defects were found in the sewer system itself—the sewers
were simply surcharged and overwhelmed by the unusually large amount of rain that fell for an exceptional
duration.

36 It should be noted that some homeowners have reported that they escaped flooding damage by 37 simply installing a drain backflow preventer in their basement floor drains. This may prove to be an 38 inexpensive solution going forward for homeowners such as the claimant.

The unusual 200-year storm that occurred on September 11-12, 2022 is considered an "act of God," which is a natural event or disaster that cannot be reasonably foreseen or prevented. The City and the Utility cannot be held legally liable for such "acts of God," over which the City and the Utility have no control.

- For the reasons set forth above, the City cannot be held legally liable for the alleged damages andthis claim should be disallowed.
