2022 CAPER

- The CAPER is an overview of all work completed using funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development
 - Community Development Block Grants
 - Emergency Solutions Grant
 - HOME Investments Partnerships
- A yearly check in on goal accomplishments set in the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan

2022 CAPER – MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 5 buildings demolished
 - These properties were deemed blighted and were unable to be rehabbed
 - The demolitions make way for future development
- Purchase of new street lights for the Uptown Neighborhood
 - To be installed in 2023
 - Energy efficient, smart technology, and transfers ownership of lights to City of Racine
 - Approximately 5,000 people live in the service area

2022 CAPER – MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 875 households assisted through Public Services – Economic Mobility
 - Extended Community Center Hours
 - RUSD Mental Health Counseling
- 201 households assisted through Public Services – Housing Mobility
 - HRI First Time Homebuyer Program

2022 CAPER – MICROENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT

- WWBIC Assisted 32 microenterprises with \$5,000 grants
- Legacy Redevelopment Corporation assisted 11 microenterprises with \$10,000-\$15,000 forgivable loans
- 43 microenterprises total were assisted.

2022 CAPER - HOMEOWNERSHIP

- 2 homes were completed using HOME Investments Partnerships
 - In partnership with Racine Revitalization Partnership
 - Both for sale (939 Center St. and 620 Hubbard)

2022 CAPER – HOMELESS SERVICES

- 756 persons served through Emergency Shelter and Day Shelters
- 42 persons served through Rapid ReHousing
- Other funds are combined to serve homeless persons
