



Edgar Tafel

Edgar Tafel was born in New York City in 1912. After attending New York University, he travelled to Spring Green, Wisconsin to work as an apprentice with the architect Frank Lloyd Wright and was one of the original members of the Taliesin Fellowship that convened in 1932. Tafel was married and divorced in the 1930s. Tafel worked extensively on a number of Wright's projects, notably managing the construction of the S.C. Johnson Building in Racine, Wisconsin from 1936 to 1939 along with Wingspread, the home of Herbert F. Johnson,

outside Racine. Tafel left Taliesin abruptly in 1941 and remarried. His second wife died in 1951, and he had no children. He was frequently referred to as a post-modernist in the 1960s and 1970s, though he rejected the label. Later in life Tafel wrote the books *Apprentice to Genius:* Years with Frank Lloyd Wright in 1979 and About Wright: An Album of Recollections by Those Who Knew Frank Lloyd Wright in 1993. During his career, Edgar Tafel designed 80 houses, 35 religious buildings, and 3 college campus master plans. Edgar Tafel died in 2011 at the age of 98.⁸²
