Staff received three potential fair housing complaints:

1) Staff received on fair housing complaint. Caller is in a wheel chair and has a stairway in his apartment. The landlord said he would install a ramp, but hasn't yet. The caller wanted the ramp installed, but did not understand he may have to pay for it. The caller decided not to file yet, he wanted to try and negotiate with the landlord before filing. Staff referred the caller to the HUD FHEO office to learn more about his rights. The caller will call back with any further questions.

Landlord Tenant Case:

1) A young married couple came into the office to visit and were worried because they moved out of an apartment because of conditions. The former landlord threated to take the family to court for breaking the lease. Staff explained the landlord's duty to mitigate and helped them put together documentation of the problems. The family also connected with Legal Action Wisconsin who stated the same thing. The family is now in a much safer and better unit.
